A RESOLUTION SETTING THE SALARIES FOR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY FOR THE YEAR 1975-1976.

Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa

SECTION 1. The following persons and positions named shall be paid the salaries or wages indicated and the clerk is authorized to issue checks, less legally required or authorized deductions from the amounts set out below, on the bi-weekly basis, and make such contributions to I.P.E.R.S. and Social Security or other purpose as required by law or authorization of the Council, all subject to audit and review by the Council.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ALLOCATION OF APPROPRIATION TO ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE FUNDS OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, FOR EXPENDITURES IN THE FISCAL YEAR OF 1975-1976 AND ESTIMATING REVENUES AND OTHER RESOURCES FOR SAID PERIOD.

SECTION I. APPROPRIATION The funds and revenues of this city in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976 are hereby allocated and appropriated to maintain and operate the city government and its various services as follows:

No transfer between accounts within any program shall be made except by a resolution approved by a majority vote of the whole number of the council, or as otherwise provided by city ordinance. Transfers between programs shall be made in accordance with state law.

All income from special taxes for payments of bonds and interest in excess of the above estimates is also appropriated for the purpose for which such special taxes were levied, as provided by the resolution authorizing such respective bond issues.

SECTION 2. ACCOUNTS. The Clerk is hereby directed to maintain the accounts set out in Exhibit A and to charge all claims to the proper accounts in accordance with activity and purpose as required by state law. The Treasurer is directed to set up the necessary accounts and records required by law in accordance with Section 1 of this resolution.

WHEREUPON THE MAYOR DECLARED the following Ordinance duly adopted.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2 OF MUNICIPAL CODE.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE METHOD OF A RUN OFF ELECTION IN LIEU OF A PRIMARY ELECTION FOR THE CHOOSING OF PERSONS FOR ELECTIVE MUNICIPAL OFFICES.

Be It Enacted by the Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to adopt the alternative of using a run-off election in lieu of a primary election for the choosing of persons for elective municipal offices, and prescribing the procedures to be followed therein.

SECTION 2. Run-off Election Adopted. The provisions of Section 376.9 Code of Iowa, 1975, providing for a run-off election are hereby adopted in lieu of the requirements for a primary in Sections 376.6 and 376.7 thereof

SECTION 3. Regular Municipal Election. Within 24 hours following the fortieth day prior to the municipal election, the clerk shall forward the petitions of all candidates that have been properly filed with the clerk, to the county commissioners of elections who shall then do all things necessary for conducting the municipal election.

SECTION 4. When Required. Each candidate at a municipal election receiving a majority of all votes cast for the office sought shall be declared elected. A run-off election shall be held only for positions unfilled because of failure of a sufficient number of candidates to receive a majority vote in the regular city election. Candidates who do not receive a majority of votes cast for the office for which they have filed as follows:

1. If no candidate for a single office receives a majority of the votes cast for that office, the two (2) candidates receiving the largest number of votes shall be placed upon the run-off ballot.

2. If any of the top candidates, in an at-large contest, to the number of positions to be filled receive less than a majority of the votes cast at the election, those candidates receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared elected and those candidates receiving the next highest number of votes but not having a majority, to the number of twice the number of unfilled positions, shall be placed on the run-off ballot.

SECTION 5. Publication of Ballot. If there must be a run-off election the commissioner of elections shall cause to be published once in a newspaper or newspaper published within the municipal corporation and of general circulation therein, or in a newspaper of general circulation in the city if there are none published therein, in proper form, the names of persons as they are to appear on the municipal run-off ballot in a typical precinct, said publication to be not less than four (4) days before the run-off election.

SECTION 6. Run-Off Election. Any such run-off election shall be held two (2) weeks after the regular municipal election. The run-off election shall be conducted in the same manner as provided by law for conducting municipal elections except that there shall be no added voter registrations accepted for said election but transfers may be accepted until ten (10) days before the election, as now provided under law.

SECTION 7. Repealer. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. When Effective; This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
