The amount and numbers of the Bonds held by any person executing such instrument and the date of his holding the same may be proved by the affidavit of such person or by a certificate executed by any responsible bank or trust company showing that on the date therein mentioned such persons had on deposit with such bank or trust company

the Bonds described in such certificate.

Section 16. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.
