We have conducted an engineering study on Iowa 92 in Fontanelle and we wish to make the following recommendations for speed limits.

150 ft. West of West City Limits 200 ft West of Railroad Just West of Third Street Just East of Fifth Street 30 200 ft. West of Railroad Just West of Third Street
Just East of Fifth Street
Just East of Ninth Street 25 Just East of Ninth Street 35 600 ft. East of Railroad Bridge

These proposed speed limits are above the present speed limits in some locations. However, they are much more realistic and in line with what traffic is actually doing. Many research studies have shown that what traific is actually doing. Many research studies have shown that traffic moves at the speed where the drivers feel safe and comfortable, regardless of posted speed limits. Continuous and rigid enforcement can force temporary compliance with a too low speed limit. It will generate a lot of "speed trap" complaints and when stopped, traffic rapidly goes back to its former habits. A properly set speed limit is useful as a proper tool to act against the few that speed excessively and it encourages the majority of the drivers to drive at the same speed, the safest condition

the majority of the drivers to drive at the same speed, the safest condition.

The Code of Iowa gives the authority to set speed limits on Primary

Road Extensions to the Transportation Commission. Therefore, there is no official action for Fontanelle To take. We do want local input before mading a recommendation to the Commission. Would you discuss these porposed speed limits with your Chief of Police, Mayor and other appropriate officials and let me know Fontanelle's thinking.
