SECTION 1. Pursuant to published notice and following public hearing on the 2nd day of April, 1979, so required by Sections 362.3 and 380.8, Code of Iowa, 1977, there is hereby adopted by the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, the "City Code of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 1978."

SECTION 2. All of the provisions of the CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1978, shall be in force and effect on and after the 2nd day of April, 1979.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or part thereof in force on the 2nd day of April, 1979, and not contained th the CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1978, are hereby repealed from and after the 2nd day of April, 1979, except as hereafter provided.

SECTION 4. That the repeal provided for in the preceding section of this ordinance shall not affect any offense or act committed or done or any penalty or forfeiture incurred or any contract or right established or accruing before the 2nd day of April, 1979, nor shall such repeal affect any ordinance or resolution promising or guaranteeing the payment of money by the City or authorizing the issuance of any bonds of said City or any evidence of said City's indebtedness or or any contract or obligation assumed by said City; nor shall said repeal affect the administrative ordinances or resolutions of the Council not in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of "THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1978"; nor shall
