The Main thing is the wheeling of power. Mr. Mehl felt that the determination of which one to buy from should be made in the very near future.

The Council set Wednesday, August 8th at 8:00 a. m. for a meeting for the final decision on purchasing power.

There had been a request to run new electrical wires to the Russell Raasch property, as the existing wires are in bad shape. It was decided that new wires would be run to the existing pole and not to go underground until later.

The Mayor had received complaints about people parking to near the sidewalks and making the sidewalk impassible. The Council instructed the Marshal to write illegal parking tickets for those cars blocking the sidewalk.

There was discussion about acquiring a new office chair for the Clerk. Prices are to be checked before any decision can be reached.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall with Mayor Pro-Tem presiding. Council Members present were: Art Baudler, Deane Darrow, Andy Gentle and Keith Westphal. Absent: Ralph Means.

Notice of this meeting had been posted and the news media notified.

Motion by Andy Gentle to approve the Agenda. Seconded by Keith Westphal. Carried.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss what to do about repairing the motor on the tar kettle or the choice of buying a new motor; or hiring someone to fix the streets; and also discussion on an electric transformer bank near the Farmer's Co-op.

Motor repairs for the Tar Kettle would cost \$1000 and a new motor was quoted at \$1852.

Delmer Miller had called Henningsen Construction to inquire if they could repair the streets and what the cost would be. The quoted price was 48¢ a square yard for single coat plus 18¢ a square yard for primer, for a total of 66¢ per square yard. On the priority list of streets to be repaired are West Maple, 4th Street to the Nursing Home, 9th Street from Maple to Jefferson, and Maple street from 8th to 9th, and the Public Square.

Motion by Keith Westphal to hire Henningsen Construction to repair streets. Seconded by Art Baudler. Carried.

Delmer Miller informed the Council that a new electric transformer bank was needed to serve the Farmer's Cop Elevator. The present load is 1141 Amps and the Elevator plans to add another 200 Amp. load. Quotes received for a new transformer (pad mount) was \$4614. with a 12 to 14 week delivery. A re-wound transformer was quoted at \$3695. with a 2 to 3 week delivery.

Motion by Keith Westphal to buy a re-wound 500 KVA Transformer to furnish the Elevator with additional electricity. Seconded by Art Baudler. Carried.

Motion by Keith Westphal to adjourn. Seconded by Andy Gentle. Carried.
