Motion by Deane Darrow to approve Cigarette Permits for Gail Hepler dba The Hitching Post; Josephine Parkis dba Joe-Bobs; Sameer Boshi dba Fontanelle Drug; Ethel R. McCants dba Babe's Cafe; Herman & Madeline Strom dba Strom Grocery; and Evelyn Baudler dba Twilight Cafe when all applications and fees are received. Seconded by Andy Gentle. Carried.

Motion by Eugene Van Vleet to hire Dale Nelson to rebuild the east well fence. Seconded by Andy Gentle. Carried.

Gary Brown met with the Council to inform them of the CETA program which offers employment to qualified youths on limited income, and ask the Council to consider the hiring of himself, Dallas and Duane Sickles. The City is to furnish the materials needed and a supervisor, and the government will pay at the rate of \$3.10 per hour.

Lloyd Rafter had ask that the Water line be lowered at his residence since it freezes there in the winter. The City will try to get this done yet this summer.

The Mayor received a letter from Respresentative Tom Harkin, inviting the Mayor & Council to a meeting on Grants for Sewer improvements. Mayor Means, Deane Darrow and Delmer Miller will plan to attend the meeting held at the 5x80 Club from 9:00 to 12:30 June 20th.

Manley Young and David Sickles have requested that City Water be installed at their residences.

Council Member Deane Darrow stated that several cross-walks should be fixed. It was suggested that Don Rutledge might be contacted to do the work.

Delmer Miller related to the Council that there had been damage done to the Trailer Court residences and to the Dennis Frank home when a defective transformer blew up, and ask the Council if restitution should be made.

Motion by Eugene Van Vleet to replace equipment of equal value for equipment damaged at the Trailer Court and Dennis Frank residences due to the defective transformer. Seconded by Deane Darrow. Carried.

After much discussion on the vandalism that has been done to some City property the Council decided to offer a \$100. reward for information leading to the conviction of anyone vandalizing City Property. This is to be published twice in the Fontanelle Observer, and a sign will be made and posted on the restrooms in the park.

Marshall Jones stated that the restrooms need waste paper baskets put in each one.

It was decided by the Council that there should be signs posted on each side of the park stating "No Pets Allowed in Park"

Motion by Deane Darrow to send certified letters to those having junked cars setting around. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Carried.

The Council set June 23rd at 7:30 p.m. as a Special Meeting for discussion on wages for the coming fiscal year.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Deane Darrow, Andy Gentle, Eugene Van Vleet and Robert Weiland. Absent: Denny Sickles.

Motion by Deane Darrow to approve the agenda as posted. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Carried.

Clarence Marckmann had brought up the question about B-B Guns and dogs. Since the Code covers the problem, all that is needed is a complaint signed and the Marshall is then authorized to act.

Motion by Deane Darrow to have the sidewalk adjoining the Recreation Slab formed up and new cement run. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Bruce Herr is to be contacted to do the work.

Repairs are to be done at the Library, before new construction starts. The Council felt that since Derwin Deo was the contractor to do the new construction they would ask him to also repair the building and put a 6" cement cap on the old well in the rear of the building.

Motion by Andy Gentle to have Deo Construction make repairs to the Library building. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Carried.

Motion by Robert Weiland to get a gas powered weed eater for City use. Seconded by Deane Darrow. Carried.

Motion by Eugene Van Vleet to authorize the transfer of Federal Revenue Sharing money to funds as needed. Seconded by Andy Gentle. Carried.
