Chief Ray Stewart presented his report to the committee. The Department had a total of 42 calls, of which there were 25 rescue calls, 11 fires and 6 meetings. A total of 219 men answered the 11 fires and 6 meetings. Total amount due for the calls is \$876.00.

He also reported on the cost of converting Scott Air Packs over to Pressure Demand. The newest Scott Pack converted over will be in the \$130. range. The two old Packs will run in the \$350. range and after they are fixed they still would not be approved by NIOSHA. New Scott Air Packs are presently \$645. but will go up \$95.00 July 1. The Department has 50 pounds of ABC Dry Chemical on order, and are having the older 2 1/2" fire hose fixed into 20 foot lengths to use at hydrants.

Mrs. Bill Chambers and Mrs. Dorothy Freeman conferred with the Council on drainage problems and street. Mrs. Chambers stated that the drainage from the Merrill Jones property goes right next to her garden, and also affects their driveway and street.

Mrs. Chambers stated that if the situation was not corrected she would talk to the Health Department. She also stated that the road going by their property tilts to the north and they get all the water drainage from that, and she wants the road leveled and tarred. The City is to contact the County to see what might be done, and will also ask Mr. Jones to try and correct the problem. It was stated that he may have to put in a septic tank with lateral spurs. Mrs. Freeman ask that no drainage run directly to the west, as it would affect her well.

Mr. Andy Baird of SICOG was present to meet with the Council concerning the Economic Development Administrations offering of another Incentive Program Grant. The Government would pay 75% and the local city would have to pay 25%. EDA would ask approximately \$667. from each of 10 cities. However, if not enough towns go along with the program, it will probably be dropped.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

It was decided that the street from Dale Means property to 8th & Jefferson should be repaired, and from 6th & Main east to the Highway; and past the Lutheran Church east 1 block and south two blocks should also be repaired. Cold Patch should be put in the driveways of Kenneth Frank and Eunice Bradford where damaged.

It was reported that the floor of the bandstand is in bad shape and is to be repaired before painting is done.

Motion by Deane Darrow to send a "Thank You" to the County Engineer for the use of trucks used for cleaning up after the 4th of July storm damage. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by Deane Darrow to approve the Statement of Values presented by Employers Mutual Insurance Co. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Carried.

Eugene Van Vleet introduced Resolution No. 80.13 entitled "Resolution Setting the Salaries for appointed Officers and Employees of the City for the year 1980-81" and moved for its adoption. Deane Darrow seconded the motion to adopt. Roll was called, and the following voted: AYES: Deane Darrow, Denny Sickles and Eugene Van Vleet. NAYS: None.
