Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read. Delmer Miller reports that the mechanic to fix the street patrol is to call December 2nd, and Delmer plans to get the machine into Veatch Construction building. Electric Rate changes were discussed. Delmer Miller had suggested a 25% increase in all structured rates, but a special meeting will be held later to discuss the matter.

David Routh and Rev. Routh met with the Council. David ask when old Utility poles were going to be taken down. He thought there should be an agenda as to when certain things were going to be done.

Harold Winkelman had inquired as to the possibility of getting Utilities put in at the Haines property. This would entail boring under the railroad track and running approximately two blocks of water main & casing. There is a possibility of this being next spring.

There was discussion on establishing a curfew. Since much of the vandalism takes place after midnight it was suggested that the Council consider a 12 o'clock curfew. The matter of keeping the minors out of Taverns was brought up. All agreed that the Tavern owners be notified that Article #3 Paragraph #2.1-1.0301 concerning Minors in billiard rooms where beer is sold will be enforced. This is also a State Code. (Code of Iowa, 1977, Sec. 726.9)

Motion by Deane Darrow to authorize the Mayor to sign letters of Agreements #1 and #2 with the Department of Energy. Seconded by Andy Gentle. Carried.

The Council set December 29th at 7:00 p.m. as the time for a meeting to work on the budget for the coming fiscal year.

The Fire and Rescue Management Committee met at 7:00 p.m. at the City Hall with Mayor Pro-Tem Deane A. Darrow presiding. Committee members present were: Deane Darrow, Ervin Ehm, Leroy Nelson, Martin Tracy and Eugene Van Vleet. Absent: Robert Weiland.

Motion by Ervin Ehm to approve the minutes of the last meeting as read. Seconded by Eugene Van Vleet. Carried.

Motion by Marting Tracy to approve the finance report. Seconded by Leroy Nelson. Carried.

Motion by Leroy Nelson to pay the bills : Farmer's Co-op \$18.00; Unity Welding & Supply \$3.10 and the Volunteer Firemen \$632.00. Seconded by Ervin Ehm. Carried.

Chief Ray Stewart gave a report on calls and meetings and presented bills. He also reported on a maintenance contract for the "Jaws of Life" with the Parins Co. Inc. No final decision was reached on this. He reported that from June to December 15th there had been 34 calls. 19 were Rescue calls, 8 fires and 7 meetings with 158 men responding. At the Firemen's meeting on December 15th the following officers were elected. Ray Stewart fire chief; David Sickles, assistant chief; Delk Grantham, Secretary & Treasurer. These officers will start their term January 1, 1981.

There had been several complaints about the wreckless and careless manner of driving by one of the firemen. It was decided that the committee would talk to him, and a meeting for this purpose was set for February 19, 1981.
