Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller had attended a meeting in Dennison. He stated that Missouri Basin Municipal Power Agency is forwarding a letter of intent for Electric Power after 1990. M.B.P.A. will come and discuss it with the Council. Delmer suggested that this should be done when the new Council is named, and that he will set up an evening meeting.

The Sewer Lift Station at the east end of town was demolished when a pick-up crashed into it. Delmer Miller stated that they now have one pump going. Some of the work can be done by the City crew, but the motors will have to be sent in to be checked for cracked bearing and other damage that took place. He suggested taking bids on fence materials and labor of installing a new fence.

Marshall Merrill Jones ask the Council if the City Park Restrooms were going to be left open this year. A new door is needed on the east side.

Loyal Goff met with the Council to ask if a load of gravel could be placed along the east side of his property, where he parks his car. Delmer stated that this is actually a water way, but it would be checked to determine where to put any gravel.

Motion by Harold Veatch to change the status of Unemployment Insurance from the Reimbursable Status to the Contributory Status effective January 1, 1982. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Trees in the park should be trimmed when they are dormant.

Motion by Robert Weiland to contact David Bathurst to trim the trees in the park when they become dormant. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

A group representing the Enterprise Club of Fontanelle met with the Council to discuss ways of making the town more attractive, and to offer their co-operation. They would like to see the old buildings torn down and all the junked cars setting around be towed away. This would improve the looks of the town measurably.

Motion by John Stutzman to put an ad in the Fontanelle Observer regarding old cars and junk, that they will have 30 days from the date of publication to clean up their premises or they will be towed away. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Motion by John Stutzman to measure and check into the price of a new steel or wood door for the restroom in the park. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Bids on the old police car were opened by the Mayor. (2 received)

Motion by Robert Weiland to accept the highest bid of \$275. for the Police Car received from Delmer Miller. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by John Stutzman to raise the Councilmen's salary from \$3.00 per meeting to \$5.00, and the Mayor's salary accordingly. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

\*\* Note: According to the State Code of Iowa, Section 372.13 sub-section 8, this change in compensation will not become effective until January 1, 1984.

Motion by Denny Sickles to adjourn. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.
