Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller stated that he had been contacted by Surplus Property Division and they did have a 20 kwh portable generator on a skid for \$2150.00. However, it is just a single phase, and a 3 phase is needed to blow the fire whistle. It has a 6 cylinder Hercules Motor which kicks in automatically when the voltage goes down.

Marshal Merrill Jones reported that he could get tires cheaper through the state. The reverse band on the transmission of the Police Car is broken. An estimate of \$150. for just the band was given, and if a rebuilt transmission was needed the cost would be approximately \$450.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to get the Police Car transmission repaired. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Marshall Jones also reported that the City Lawn Mower needed new points and a new condenser, and this should be done before it was time to start mowing the park.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to get points and condenser on the lawn mower repaired. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Loyal Goff attended the meeting. He had met with the County Commissioner of Southern Iowa Regional Housing Authority. This was in regard to the property at 106 6th Street and 310 Summerset Street. He stated that the ground rules had been changed a year ago. Instead of rehabilitating older homes they are taking better homes that can be utilized into two apartments with the minimum of expenditures. These units rent for 25% of the renters income. Of that 25% SIRHA would take 15% for their operations and 10% would be returned to the City in lieu of taxes, since these properties would be taken off the tax roll for 40 years. He recommended that as long as the City had rejected both applications of SIRHA that the Fontanelle Development Corporation be contacted to see if funds were available for low rent housing instead of just Senior Citizens Units. Mr. Goff said he would check with Ralph Wollenhaupt and the board of the Fontanelle Development Corporation.

Denny Sickles introduced a Resolution entitled "RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR A 100% GRANT FOR THE FLOURIDATION OF THE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY FOR THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA" and moved for its adoption.

Kenneth Perry seconded the motion to adopt. Roll was called and the following voted: AYES: Denny Sickles, Kenneth Perry, Gene Jacobsen and Robert Weiland. NAYS: None.

Whereupon, the Mayor Pro-Tem declared the resolution duly adopted as:

RESOLUTION NO. 82.2

RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR A 100% GRANT FOR THE FLOURIDATION OF THE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY FOR THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA.

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Department of Dental Health has available monies for a 100% grant to be used for the flouridation of the Public Water Supply, and

WHEREAS, the City Council feels that it would benefit the public safety, health and welfare of the redieents of the City of Fontanelle.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the City of Fontanelle hereby makes application for such a grant.
