There was discussion on a bill from Tom & Cindy Kester regarding the repairing of their mailbox, in the amount of \$43.68. The Council felt that an inspection should be made to see if it was back away from the edge of the road far enough before paying the bill. Since the County Road crew cleans and sands that portion of the city street they felt the City could take care of the bill, or the County would refrain from maintaining the road.
