Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read. Delmer Miller reported that most of the underground in the south part of town has been changed over, but there may be a problem at the Football field with transformers. Water has been dug in for Joe Brownrigg and Wilbur Heckman. The alley leading to Brownrigg's property will have to be leveled off as soon as weather permits. Henry Wilson has ask for a 400 amp. service to run his grain bins. This will mean a different transformer. Since this wervice will be seasonal a rate will have to be worked out so as to be fair to Mr. Wilson and also the City.

The watertower has been cleaned and spot painted. Delmer also stated that in the very near future the water mains and plant would have to be back washed and the holding tanks thoroughly cleaned. It was suggested that a notice should be put in the paper when this is to be done so that people would know about the condition of the water.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Cigarette permit applications for Louie Strom dba Strom's Grocery, Sam Boshi dba Fontanelle Drug, Robert J. Ball dba The Hitching Post Lounge, Raedeane McCants dba Babe's Cafe, and Josephine Parkis dba Jo-Bob's Lounge. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

There was discussion about the park restrooms. Motion by Kenneth Perry to lock the park restrooms at 9 p.m.. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Since we have not heard from the City Attorney Paul Boysen regarding the amending of the Code in regard to disturbing the peace under the Motor vehicle chapter, the Clerk is to call him again. This was to have been done for the May 3rd meeting.

There was much discussion about law enforcement. Some people have been driving through the park and through homeowners yards, and the Council feels that perhaps it would be beneficial to the City if both Marshall's were talked to and different working hours were worked out.

Wages were discussed. After much discussion the Council decided that there would be a 30¢ an hour increase for all employees. The employees agreed to this suggestion.
