

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Harold Veatch, Denny Sickles and Kenneth Perry. Absent: Robert Weiland and Gene Jacobsen.

The Agenda had been posted according to law, along with Notice of this meeting.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss Law Enforcement, approve a building permit of a garage for Herbert Goetz and make a decision on Workmen's Compensation Insurance with Hall Risk Co. or to stay with Employer's Mutual.

The Mayor had contacted the Sheriff as to what could be done about vandalism in the early morning hours. The Sheriff suggested that if it was agreeable with the Marshall and Deputy that going to work at 7:30 p.m. and staying on until morning might help curb the problem. The Mayor was called at 5 o'clock a.m. about cars racing around the Lutheran Church parking lot. Since this is private property, it was suggested that the Vestry of the Lutheran Church put up signs saying "Private Parking" or "No Parking", as the parking lot has to be posted.

Hours were set for the month of July.

The Police were instructed to not talk about any Law Enforcement business in any Cafe. They are to crack down harder on any violators and to treat everyone alike. Parking on the wrong side of the street was another complaint. When a juvenile is picked up for a violation the parents will be notified on the first offense and a ticket will be issued for the second offense.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the building permit for Herbert Goetz for a garage to be built. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

A letter from the Hall Risk Insurance company regarding Workmen's Compensation was presented for study. The Council decided that even though Employers Mutual was a bit more expensive they would rather stay insured by them rather than to change companies.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to adjourn. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

The Fire and Rescue Management Committee met at City Hall at 7:00p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Committee Members present were: Harold Veatch, Leroy Nelson, Robert Weiland, Roger Frank and Ervin Ehm. Absent: Kenneth Perry.

Notice of the meeting and the agenda were posted as required by law.

Motion by ~~Leroy~~ Nelson to approve the minutes of the last meetings as read. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to approve the Financial Report. Seconded by Roger Frank. Carried.

Chief David Sickles presented the following bills for payment: Volunteer Fire Department \$460.00 for 6 fire calls and 6 meetings involving a total of 115 men. Schildberg's Inc. Repairs to the Fire Truck \$223.57 Greenfield Oil Co. 4 new tires for the bush truck \$300.00.

Motion by Leroy Nelson to pay all bills. Seconded by Roger Frank. Carried.

Mr. Pat Jennings and Mr. Newell Wolfe representing the United Telephone Company met with the Committee regarding the new Fire Bar System. Approximate date for the digital conversion is January 1983. They explained that they do not sell the fire bar system but they do lease them.

A Basic system equipped with 10 lines has an installation charge of \$550. and rents for \$78.10 per month. This Basic System is expandable in multiples of 10 lines. The Siren Control which is optional has a \$19.00 installation charge and the monthly charge is \$4.55. Buttons on the phone with which the siren is activated are 55¢ per month per phone button. Mr. Wolfe explained this as an off premise extension and the monthly charge is \$1.30 per quarter mile.

A 20 line system has the installation charge of \$914. with the monthly rental charge of \$124.30 with the above options the same.

A final commitment will have to be given at the August meeting on which of the two systems is desired.

Chief David Sickles also ask the Committee if the Fire Department could purchase a "flat bed" for the Bush Truck, as it would be so much handier for the Firemen to get the equipment out. Mr. Sickles had contacted the Omaha Standard Co. and they had quoted a price of \$684.

Motion by Ervin Ehm to buy a new "flat-bed" for the 4x4 Bush Truck from Omaha Standard at the quoted price of \$684. installed; and the Utility boxes which are needed are to be built locally. Seconded by Leroy Nelson. Carried.
