Mr. Ernie Wagner of Greenfield met with the Council regarding the building that he owns at the corner of 5th & Washington Streets. He informed the Council that he would be tearing down this building. He ask for a good location of the existing sewer and water mains where they come into his basement. He said they would be putting in a 7½ foot fill. He is salvaging all usable materials out of the building and then plans to pull it down. The large tree and garage will also be done away with. He ask that Delmer Miller pull the meters and the meter socket and cap the sewer, and that the street be blocked. The person pulling the building down is to have Insurance for any damages. He estimated that the street would be blocked for two days.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read. Delmer Miller reported that there was a faulty underground wire between Virgil Martins (at 9th & Maple Street) and the East railroad trestle.

Since there is a new oil station doing business (Pit-Stop 92) it was decided that the City would take the three stations in alternate order to buy gas for the City vehicles.

Due to the fact that methane gas is undetectable Delmer Miller felt that it was imperative that a ventilating blower be purchased for the lift station and manholes.

Motion by Denny Sickles to order a 3 HP ventilating blower for ventilating manholes. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

There was discussion on the water hook-up for the three buildings owned by Keith Westphal. At present they all are run together. It was felt that this could call for a special meeting.

Delmer Miller explained the Power Cost Adjustment to the Council. Marshall Jones informed the Council that he was having problems with the lights and door at the restrooms in the park.

The Council informed the employees that they had received to many complaints about long coffee breaks and ask that they be curtailed to only a short time.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Building permits for Jim Dickerson and Gene Jacobsen each being for a garage. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

There have been some complaints about traffic at the corner of 6th & Main Street. There was much discussion about installing stop signs at the corner. No definite decision was reached.

There was discussion about hiring a different lawyer. It would be more convenient to have an Attorney in Greenfield instead of having to go or to call Creston each time. Some of the items sent to the Creston Lawyer in April, 1982 still have not been taken care of.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to raise the "Meter Deposit" for Utilities to \$50. (\$20. for Water and \$30 for Electricity) plus Service Charge. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Purpose of the meeting was to interview the three applicants for the part-time police job.

Dean Sueck: Navy Veteran. Went to University of Iowa until Government cut off GI Grant money. Not working at present. Married, 4 children. Was experienced in shore patrol, night watch and orderly on board ship. Would like to have approximately \$4.75 per hour.

Ronald Highland: Is part time police officer in Stuart covering for reserve officers. Also has a wood working shop. Is with the Rescue Unit in Stuart. Wants to get into full time Law Enforcement. \$4.75 per hour wanted.

Neil Hoadley: Not working at present. Spent 8 years in the Marines. Experienced for high security guard duty, crowd control, and prison riot back up duty, and has had radar experience. \$4.00 to \$5.00 an hour desired.

After much discussion and reviewing of the applications the Mayor and Council decided to hire Mr. Ronald Highland on a 30 day trial basis. He is to ride with Marshall Jones the first night. He will be expected to work only one week end a month, and will work out a schedule of two days a week with Marshall Jones. The Policemen were instructed that the Patrol Car is not to leave town unless it is on absolutely Police business. In case of sickness the Policemen will fill in for each other.

There being no further business, Gene Jacobsen made the Motion to adjourn. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.
