Department reports were heard and correspondence read. Delmer Miller explained to the Council about the customers Right and Remedies section on delinquent light bills. If a delinquent bill has not been paid they have to sign an agreement to pay it off within one year and keep the current bill paid up.

The Iowa Association of Municipal Utilities is holding a meeting November 9th at the Atlantic Country Club. It was decided to ask Mr. Bart Rule about the rights of a City collecting bills.

The Government is proposing a 7% raise in the cost of water powered electricity.

Delmer Miller reported that the Lift Station has both shafts broken, but one pump is working.

Water at the Keith Westphal building was discussed as to what the City should charge for connecting it from the street to his building.

David Homan met with the Council to discuss the possibility of getting Cable T.V. in Fontanelle. He has received word from Heritage Cablevision that for the time being they were not interested as they felt that Fontanelle was too small. The City could be involved in acquiring property to put a tower on. The Clerk had received word from Midlands Cable T.V. and the Council ask Mr. Homan to contact them for an opinion. He had made a private survey of people within the City and found that 84% were in favor of it, but some would probably not have it in their homes.

Marshall Ronald Highland ask the Council about purchasing a rechargeable flashlight and a Log Organizer. Although they are considered very expensive the flashlight will not have to have batteries and this would be a considerable savings.

Motion by Denny Sickles to buy a Model #2 Flashlight with recharging unit and also a Log Organizer for the City Police. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

A contract had been signed with CETA for the hiring of Dean Sueck. The Council and Mayor felt it advisable for him to ride with Marshall Highland for about two weeks. They will decide on the other duties that he is to perform.

Motion by Kenneth Perry that the City will no longer accept any partial payment of Utility Bills. The Bills must be paid in full. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

The Clerk was instructed to put up a sign stating the City no longer accepts partial payment on Utility Bills. Thus informing the people of the new rule.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to introduce an Ordinance to amend the City Code Title II Division 1, Chapter 2 relating to acceleration of motor vehicles for its first consideration. Motion seconded by Harold Veatch. Roll was called. All voted AYE.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the City Code of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 1978 adopted by Ordinance No. 108, passed April 2, 1978, by enacting a new Section 2.1-2.0310 to Title II, Division 1, Chapter 2, relating to acceleration of vehicles.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 1978 adopted by Ordinance No. 108, passed April 2, 1978, be and is hereby amended by enacting a new Section 2.1-2.0310 to Title II Division 1, Chapter 2, relating to acceleration of vehicles to read as follows:

2.1-2.0310 EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION. It shall be unlawful for any person in the operation of a motor vehicle, including motorcycles, to so accelerate such vehicle as to cause audible noise by the friction of the tires on the pavement or to cause the tires of the vehicle to leave skid marks on the pavement, or to cause the front wheel of a motorcycle to leave the ground more than two (2) inches, except when such acceleration is reasonably necessary to avoid a collision.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

Monday, November 8, 1982 was set for a meeting for the second consideration of the Ordinance.

Motion by Harold Veatch to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried

The City Council met in Special Session at City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Gene Jacobsen, Robert Weiland and Harold Veatch. Absent: Kenneth Perry and Denny Sickles.

The purpose of the meeting was to consider the Ordinance which was introduced at the regular meeting of November 1st pertaining to Excessive Acceleration, and to approve a building permit.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to introduce for its second consideration an "ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE BY AMENDING THE TRAFFIC CODE: TITLE II Division 1, Chapter 2, RELATING TO EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES." Motion was seconded by Harold Veatch. Roll was called. Those voting AYE: Harold Veatch, Robert Weiland and Gene Jacobsen. NAYS: None. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to waive the third reading since there were no objectors either oral or written. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Roll was called. Those voting AYE: Gene Jacobsen, Robert Weiland and Harold Veatch. Motion carried.

Motion by Robert Weiland to finally adopt the Ordinance as read. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Roll was called. Those voting AYE: Harold Veatch, Gene Jacobsen and Robert Weiland.

Whereupon, the Mayor declared the Ordinance as duly adopted as:

ORDINANCE NO. 114

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE BY AMENDING THE TRAFFIC CODE, TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, RELATING TO EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 1978 adopted by Ordinance No. 108, passed April 2, 1978, be and is hereby amended by enacting a new Section 2.1-2.0310 to Title II Division 1, Chapter 2, relating to acceleration of vehicles to read as follows:

2.1-2.0310 EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION. It shall be unlawful for any person in the operation of a motor vehicle, including motorcycles, to so accelerate such vehicle as to cause audible noise by the friction of the tires on the pavement or to cause the tires of the vehicle to leave skid marks on the pavement, or to cause the front wheel of a motorcycle to leave the ground more than two (2) inches, except when such acceleration is reasonably necessary to avoid a collision.
