BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA: Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 1978 adopted by Ordinance No. 108, passed April 2, 1978, be and is hereby amended by enacting a new Section 2.1-2.0310 to Title II Division 1, Chapter 2,

relating to acceleration of vehicles to read as follows:
2.1-2.0310 EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION. It shall be unlawful for any person in the operation of a motor vehicle, including motorcycles, to so accelerate such vehicle as to cause audible noise by the friction of the tires on the pavement or to cause the tires of the vehicle to leave skid marks on the pavement of to cause the tires of the vehicle to leave skid marks on the pavement, or to cause the front wheel of a motorcycle to leave the ground more than two (2) inches, except when such acceleration is reasonably necessary to avoid a collision.

2.1-2.0310 EXCESSIVE ACCELERATION. It shall be unlawful for any person in the operation of a motor vehicle, including motorcycles, to so accelerate such vehicle as to cause audible noise by the friction of the tires on the pavement or to cause the tires of the vehicle to leave skid marks on the pavement, or to cause the front wheel of a motorcycle to leave the ground more than two (2) inches, except when such acceleration is reasonably necessary to avoid a collision.
