Delmer Miller reported that there is a Cable TV Seminar at the Savory Hotel in Des Moines on December 15th starting at 9:00 a.m. with a \$25.00 fee.

Delmer also reported to the Council that the Electric Tariff has not been brought up to date in several years and he ask permission to have Mr. Robert Hauge bring it up to date. Mr. Hauge had quoted a price of \$250.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to send Delmer Miller and two Councilmen to the IAMU Cable TV Seminar and their expenses. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to contact Robert Hauge to bring the Tariff up to date. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Wm. Glassell, Albert Ehrenfried, Don Rivers and Terry Jaschke met with the Council regarding a drainage problem affecting their properties. They maintain that a culvert on Main Street is throwing thousands of gallons of water into a puddle 50 feet to 70 feet wide and 200 feet long. There was feeling that the 8 inch tile might be clogged with tree roots. Mr. Art Sullivan from Greenfield said that 2 rows of 5 inch tile should be put in (one on each side), for a distance of 700 feet which would take the excess water to the railroad track. The Council will go and make a complete evaluation and also ask the Soil Conservation Committee to make an evaluation as to how to relieve the problem. This area is a natural waterway so it would entail grading and removal of trees.

Delmer Miller also reported that he had been contacted by the Western Area power Administration regarding Electricity. He feels that new capacitors are needed as we are getting the efficiency that we should be getting. The City also needs to buy a 24 foot ladder. Fiberglass was recommended even though it is more expensive it would outlast a wooden one several times. Delmer also asked what should be done with the Street Sweeper. It has a cracked head. He ask if it should be fixed or junked. He is to contact Williams Head Service at Nevada to see if it can be fixed.

Motion by Robert Weiland to hire someone to evaluate the water drainage problem on the properties of Wm. Glassell, Terry Jaschke and Don Rivers properties. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Police Chief Ronald Highland informed the Council that the Police car needs new snow tires as they had to put on chains last week-end. He ask The Goodyear Store at Adel for a quote of price, and they quoted a price of \$105. for two new snow tires including mounting and balancing. Mr. Highland said he needed the snow tires now, and in the spring a new set of regular tires would be needed and he would store the snow tires.

Motion by Harold Veatch to buy two (2) new snow tires for the Police Car. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Mr. Highland also reported that something is wrong with the portable hand held radio. When in use no one can hear them.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have Midwest Electronics of Des Moines quote a bid on the repairing of the hand held portable radio. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Mr. Highland also reported that there were gas fumes coming up into the car, and he felt that a new exhaust system was needed. The Council recommended that he take it to Brittons to have it repaired.

Chief Highland reported that a scanner was needed and that Raper CB had one that was reasonable. It was a 210XL(AC/DC) for \$235.

The Department of Health notified the City that they are to receive a grant for flouridation of the Water System in the amount of \$4500.

Motion by Denny Sickles to authorize the Mayor to sign the Contract with the Department of Health regarding the flouridation of the water supply system. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried, but with Weiland voting Nay.

Lester Elliott had ask about widening his driveway, but was unable to be present at the meeting. Delmer Miller is to check with Mr. Elliott to see what he wants done.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to adjourn. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.
