The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Harold Veatch, Gene Jacobsen, Kenneth Perry and Denny Sickles. Absent: Robert Weiland. Trustee Roger Frank was also present.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss with Mr. Terry Lutz, Engineer from McClure Engineering Co. of Fort Dodge any possibility of getting a grant for a new fire station, and to meet with Mr. Graham Daugherty of CMI Cable T.V. Company as to what the Company had to offer.

Mr. Lutz informed the Council that a Fire Station does not rank as high on the priority list as some other projects. Funds are limited. Out of 880 towns in the state 420 submitted applications last year, and only 65 to 70 were actually funded.
