

Departmental Reports were heard. Chief Ronald Highland reported that new Law Handbooks were needed and the portable radio was in need of repair. Also he noted that the brakes on the Police Car should be fixed. Chief Highland thought the problem with the radio was the antenna and battery. He reported that both he and Dean Sueck had qualified on the range to carry a weapon. He informed the Council that he felt it necessary for any Police Officer to requalify at least twice a year, and that an instructor was always available. As for the Academy Training, the January class is full, but he is on standby for February and March. There is a guaranteed opening in August.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to purchase a new Criminal Code Hand Book and a Traffic Code Handbook as soon as the new price list comes out. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Harold Veatch, Gene Jacobsen, Kenneth Perry and Denny Sickles. Absent: Robert Weiland. Trustee Roger Frank was also present.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss with Mr. Terry Lutz, Engineer from McClure Engineering Co. of Fort Dodge any possibility of getting a grant for a new fire station, and to meet with Mr. Graham Daugherty of CMI Cable T.V. Company as to what the Company had to offer.

Mr. Lutz informed the Council that a Fire Station does not rank as high on the priority list as some other projects. Funds are limited. Out of 880 towns in the state 420 submitted applications last year, and only 65 to 70 were actually funded.

Fontanelle has already been rated through Census data by formula. Fontanelle already has 180 points. It was decided to have the Southern Iowa Council of Governments make out the application. This application has to be in by the middle of March. If a grant is given you must go through the whole Letting Process. He stated that any Fund Raising should be started, and any cash that the City could give is very important. Mr. Lutz stated that if their Engineering Co. was used on a per diem basis it was \$500. If the City does not get the grant the charge might run 200 to 300.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have Mr. Lutz draw up a plan and present a cost estimate for a new fire station. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried. A Special Meeting will be held February 9th at 7:00 p.m. to decide on this.

Mr. Graham Daugherty gave an interesting review of what CMI Cable T.V. has to offer. They have the basic 4 networks plus 6 satellite channels with two optional services also available. At present they have franchises in Woodbine, Exira, Anita & Massena, and the City of Logan is the Iowa State office. The franchise has a 3% fee of the gross revenue. His company would like to negotiate with the City or Telephone Company to rent poles by the year for aerial hook up. He stated that the rates are: Monthly Basic is \$10. per month. Basic plus 1 option is \$20. per month. If you would hook up to everything it would be \$28.50 per month. Extra converters are \$2.00 per month. One is furnished. Standard hook up is \$15. but they do have a special rate for the first 30 days which is \$7.50 for any or all channels. Collections are done from Topeka, Kansas. The CMI Company has a standard Ordinance for the Franchise which should be reviewed by the City Attorney. The City would be responsible for finding a place for a Tower and building. The tower should be 60 to 80 feet on the highest elevation. No decision was reached on this matter.

Motion by Harold Veatch to adjourn. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.
