

WHEREAS, the City of Fontanelle, Iowa has been determined to be an eligible applicant for Community Development Block Grant funds; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Fontanelle has identified its priority community development needs through extensive needs assessments, public meetings and public hearings, and activities eligible under the guidelines of the Community Development Block Grant Program are proposed to address those needs,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, By the City Council, City of Fontanelle, Iowa that the City Council does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor to file or cause to be filed an application for a Community Development Block Grant under the State of Iowa Community Development Block Grant Nonentitlement Program; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the application shall include a request for \$112,750. in Community Development Block Grant funds to construct a new Fire Station/Community Center; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council, City of Fontanelle, Iowa commits local financial support for the proposed Community Development Block Grant project in the amount of \$56,375., the source of said local effort to be General Obligation (G.O.) Bonds, contingent upon the required approval of the residents of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means, presiding. Council Members present were: Harold Veatch, Kenneth Perry, Denny Sickles, Gene Jacobsen and Robert Weiland. Absent: None.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the agenda as posted. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

The Mayor informed the Council that the County Sheriff's Department will cover for Ronald Highland on his two days off per week, but it is to be understood that this can not be on week-ends. The Sheriff informed the City that the City Police Car has to be inside when not in use. It was decided that the Police Car will be kept in the City Maintenance Building. Several other trucks and pieces of machinery will have to be moved in order to accomodate this move.

The Library Board notified the City that there is still a leak in the roof and also in the southeast corner.

The City has some benches that are in very bad shape. Vernon Grantham wants to build some new benches, and would do so if the City would furnish the lumber.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to buy new lumber for benches to be built by Vernon Grantham. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Information had been received by the Clerk from Mr. Wm. L. Mackintosh of Financial Products Corporation, 2808 South 148 Avenue Circle, Omaha, Nebraska 68144, regarding services and products on the Burroughs Series "L" machines. This Company deals with nothing but the Series "L" of the Burroughs line. Their annual contract for maintenance and service is \$1371. where the annual contract with the Burroughs company is \$1705.68. Mr. Mackintosh suggested that if the City was interested in going with Financial Products Corporation that the Contract with Burroughs should be cancelled by letter and the prorated refund should be made in the form of a check. Although a bill will be sent at the onset of the new contract with FPC they would not expect payment until Burroughs had made the refund.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to cancel the Maintenance Contract that we now have with Burroughs Corporation and sign a new Maintenance Contract with Financial Products Corporation of Omaha. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

There was a lengthy discussion on the problems of an employee having a drinking problem. His behavior has become almost intolerable. He has missed 14 days work in two months, and was picked up for OMVUI on March 14th. It is understood that he is not willing to go for treatment. Since the Council has talked to him many times and given him many chances to reform they feel his co-operation is needed, or his job will have to be terminated.

Motion by Denny Sickles to give Kerry Miller a 2 weeks notice for a leave of absence without pay for treatment. If treatment is not taken consider the job terminated, but if treatment is accepted the City will use their Insurance to pay for the treatment. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to send Dale Sickles to the Water School to be held in Atlantic from March 22 until May 24, and the City will pay the \$100. registration fee and mileage. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
