Departmental reports were heard. Delmer Miller reported that the tubing for the ditch in front of the Denny Sickles and Harold Veatch properties had been purchased.

He also reported that the tires for the Police Car had been ordered, and that he would have to take the car to Adel to get the tires mounted. He ask permission to take the Police Car to Greenfield the night before to his residence and to leave from there instead of making a trip to Fontanelle after the car. Permission was granted. Chief Highland had gotten notification by mail from the Secretary Treasurer of the Guthrie County Peace Officers Association, of a meeting to be held at the 5x80 Club. The Guthrie & Adair Peace Officers and Highway Patrol meet once a month. They have a guest speaker each month and meet on the first Wednesday night of each month, and Chief Highland ask the Council's permission to join and to pay his dues which run approximately \$20. per year.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to pay the dues for Ronald Highland to join the Adair-Guthrie Peace Officers Association. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Council Member Harold Veatch introduced a resolution entitled "RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE IOWA MUNICIPAL WORKER'S COMPENSATION ASSOCIATION AND FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE WORKER'S COMPENSATION FUND ESTABLISHED THEREUNDER" and moved for its adoption. Whereupon the Mayor declared the Resolution duly adopted as:

RESOLUTION NO. 83.6

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE IOWA MUNICIPAL WORKERS' COMPENSATION ASSOCIATION AND FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION FUND ESTABLISHED THEREUNDER

Whereas, the city is required to make payment for workers' compensation, and the employer liability claims related to workers' compensation of its employees injured in the line and scope of their duties; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Iowa permit cities to meet this obligation by jointly forming an association to pool the risks of workers' compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa Municipalities Workers' Compensation Association is such an association and the Workers' Compensation Fund established thereunder is a group self-insurance fund for workers' compensation and employer liability related to workers' compensation, and is available to member cities of the League of Iowa Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable for the city to join the Association and participate in the fund in order to more efficiently provide coverage for workers' compensation and employer liability related to workers' compensation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the city join the Iowa Municipalities Workers' Compensation Association and participate in the Workers' Compensation Fund established thereunder; and that the mayor and the city clerk are hereby authorized to execute the documents necessary for the city to join and participate therein.

It was then decided to put an ad in the Free Press and Creston Paper along with the Observer for a person for 20 hours police work and 20 hours mowing. Applications should be in by June 1st.

Delmer Miller is to get someone to fix the Southeast Corner of the Library Building. It is leaking through the sidewall bricks and needs attention.

There was a lengthy discussion on the employment of Kerry Miller. It was felt that Kerry did not fulfill his specifications on taking treatment, as he signed himself out after one week. However, he will be entering the Hospital next Monday to get the full treatment as this is a Court decision. The Council did agree to pay for the treatment for the one week that he was hospitalized. The Council felt that he did break his agreement but if he would pay for his insurance then he would not be dropped from the group policy.
