Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller stated that Ivan Eighmy wants a Chinese Elm on his parking taken out and ask if the City would pay for taking it out. After discussing the matter it was decided that if the tree is dead the City would take it out but if it is alive Mr. Eighmy should be responsible for removing it. There are no electrical lines to hinder his removing the tree.

Chief Ronald Highland stated that the Portable Hand-held radio will not transmit, but he can receive messages, and ask permission to send it in to Midwestern Electronics to have it repaired.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to send the portable radio in to Midwestern Electronics to have the transmitter repaired. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Chief Highland also reported that the wiring on the front spot light and the gear shift indicator needs fixing on the Police car. The County Sheriff's cars will be for sale the last part of July if the City is interested in buying a different patrol car.

Motion by Robert Weiland to approve the application to the Department of Environmental Quality and to remit the \$100. fee. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Mr. Pat Jennings representative of the United Telephone System was present to meet with the Council regarding a Franchise with the Telephone Company. Copies of the Ordinance were given to each Council Member and it was read and discussed.

Kenneth Perry introduced Ordinance No. 115 for its first consideration. Seconded by Robert Weiland. The second reading and consideration will be held at 7:30 p.m. on June 9th.

Jerry Purdy representing the Fontanelle Lions Club met with the Council to get approval for a Beer-Wine License for the 4th of July Celebration. The Lions Club will be having a dance on the Slab and the Slab is to be roped off so that minors can not be where the liquor is sold.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Beer-Wine License for the Lions Club. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

It was agreed by the entire Council that William Glassell could build a pole barn on the town land but an agreement should be drawn up by a lawyer. This land lies between Main Street and Scott Street on the north end of 7th Street.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve a Building permit for Steven L. Marckmann for a storage shed. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

A bid on the repair of the South east corner of the Library was received from Deo Construction in the amount of \$1890.00. He proposed to furr out the wall on the south end and east side up to the first pilaster of the old library and cover with white steel. He will leave the north window on the east side open and the other two will be closed over. There would be a cap over the top of the wall and return down approximately 3 inches on either side. Labor and Materials furnished would amount to \$1890. It was decided to find out when the Library Board meets and the Council proposed to meet with them to discuss the matter.

The Lutheran Church has put up signs in their parking lot. Gene Held said that the Church plans to raise the sidewalk as the street is higher than the walk and people have to walk through the water after a rain.

Applications and fees were received from the business places wanting Cigarette Permits. 043

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the applications for Cigarette Permits from Ethel R. McCants dba Babe's Cafe; Josephine Parkis dba Joe-Bobs Lounge; Herman & Madeline Strom dba Strom's Grocery; Robert J. Ball dba The Hitching Post Lounge; and Sameer Boshi dba Fontanelle Drug. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Bill Blazek ask the Council's permission to hold a Hillbilly Flea Market sometime in the near future. He stated that they would like to have it on a Sunday and would need two sides of the square. Those bringing things to sell usually pay \$3.00 per set up, and are ask to clean up after the sale is over. If it goes well, then he would like to hold two or three a year, but would like to hold the first one either right before or right after the County Fair. This would be held in the daytime so no extra lighting would have to be provided for.

Motion by Robert Weiland that Bill Blazek be in charge of promoting, advertising and collecting registration fees for the Hillbilly Auction to be held on Sunday July 17th with the provision that "NO GUNS" will be allowed to be sold. Money received for registration fees will be used to pay for advertising and any money left over after that will be split 50-50 between Mr. Blazek and the City. Seconded by Perry. Carried.

Wages were discussed. No decision was reached and the matter was tabled until the June 9th meeting.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Harold Veatch, Denny Sickles, Kenneth Perry, Gene Jacobsen and Robert Weiland. Absent: None.

The Council met with Terry Lutz of McClure Engineering and with Mr. Richard McClanathan of the Southern Iowa Council of Governments.

Mr. McClanathan explained the State and Federal Guidelines that must be followed when receiving Grant monies. Letters are to be sent out to several Engineering firms for requests for proposals and qualifications. At this meeting the Engineer is to be hired on qualifications not dollar amounts. A Bonding Attorney usually wants to look over the amount of dollars to be spent on a building project. Mr. McClanathan stated that the Mayor would be receiving a package with 4 Or 5 letters with forms to fill out that must be back by June 22nd.

If the Bond issue should fail the Grant money would have to be returned.

Section 2E is not included within the Contract with Southern Iowa Council of Governments. The proposed contract would be in the amount of \$7,000.

ALL DUPLICATE FILES MUST BE RETAINED FOR 3 YEARS. \$1,000. is included for audit purposes and \$1,000 can be used by the City to reimburse for calls, milage etc. It does provide for termination at the City's descretion.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Contract with Southern Iowa Council of Governments and to approve the Administration fees not to exceed \$7,000. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

SICOG is to send out a letter to several Engineering Companies. A Special Meeting will be held on June 27th at 7:30 p.m. to interview the different Interested Engineering firms.

Ordinance No. 115 was re-introduced for the second consideration.

Motion by Robert Weiland to waive the 3rd reading. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to finally adopt the Ordinance. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Roll Was called and the following voted: AYE: Harold Veatch, Gene Jacobsen, Kenneth Perry, Denny Sickles and Robert Weiland. NAYS: None Whereupon, the Mayor declared the Ordinance duly adopted.
