Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported to the Council that the roof on the City Hall and Maintenance Building were in a dire need of repair, as there are several leaks in the maintenance shed.

Motion by Denny Sickles to have the City Clerk write to three roofing companies for bids on repairing of the roof. Seconded by Robert Weiland. Carried.

Paint has been purchased for the painting of the parking stripes and the no parking zones.

Chief Ronald Highland reminded the Council that the Auction of the Sheriff's cars will be held on July 28th if they are interested in purchasing a different police car. He stated that the brakes are worn down on the present police car. It also overheats and it should be rodded and reflushed. He stated that a Major overhaul would probably be necessary in the near future, as it now has 119,601 on the speedometer.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to put a bid on a used Sheriff's car not to exceed \$2500. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Chief Highland will be going to the Police Academy on August 1st. The Academy ask that the City pay for the meals.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to pay HyVee the \$347.50 for meals for Ronald Highland while he is attending the academy. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Chief Highland also stated that the Academy required special clothing while in attendance. He ask the Council if they would be willing to pay for half the cost of these clothes.

Motion by Robert Weiland to pay for one-half the cost of the clothing needed for Ronald Highland to attend the Academy, and to pay his mileage while driving to the Academy. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

The Council reviewed the resolution on wages. It was decided that the Police should be included in the Section pertaining to days off and Holiday time.

Motion by Denny Sickles to Revise Section 2 of the Resolution on Wages to include the Police. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Section 2. HOURS, HOLIDAYS AND OVERTIME:

Overtime will be paid at the rate of time and one-half to employees Delmer Miller, Dale Sickles and Jack Zimmerline for the time spent beyond the regular 40 hour week.

Vacation as follows with no carry over. First year--No Vacation. Second year through fifth year--5 working days vacation. Year six through fifteen allowed 10 working days vacation. Sixteenth year 15 working days vacation.

Delmer Miller, Dale Sickles, Jack Zimmerline, Ronald Highland, Dan Richards and Evelyn Rohner will be allowed seven paid Holidays per year which shall be: New Years, Christmas, Memorial, Independence, Veterans, Labor and Thanksgiving Days. The two Police officers will have the option of taking pay or taking the time off for those Holidays.

Said employees must use their vacation within the year.

Employees are allowed 15 days sick leave a year, and will be allowed to accumulate 90 days sick leave.

RESOLUTION ORDERING ELECTION GRANTING

WHEREAS, there has been presented to the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, an ordinance granting a franchise to the United Telephone Company of Iowa to erect and maintain a telephone exchange in the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, which said franchise has been passed as Ordinance Number 115 by the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, and duly approved by the Mayor of said City and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, deems it advisable to submit said ordinance and franchise to the qualified voters of said City in accordance with the statutes of the State of Iowa.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa on its own motion that the question of granting said franchise be submitted to the legal voters or the qualified voters of said city at the November election all in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 364 of the Code of Iowa.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, be and they are hereby authorized to do each and everything necessary and advisable to carry this resolution into full force and effect, and that at said election the ballot be as by law provided prepared and printed by the Commissioner of Elections and that the judges and clerks of the election be named by the Commissioners.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the notice of said election shall be published not less than four days or more than twenty days in the Fontanelle Observer, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Fontanelle, Iowa.
