Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read. Chief Highland reported that a second estimate was received from Morrison's at Stuart, in the amount of 2246.48 plus the 500. on the axle. As yet we have not heard from the Insurance Company. He also stated that three out of the four tires on the rented car are bald and dangerous.

Several complaints have been heard on how Dan Richards handled the brawl at the Hitching Post Lounge, and the number of times that he had to be called to answer the calls from the sheriffs office.

Delmer Miller informed that Council that Solomon Electric wants to check out the recloser at the sub station. They will be here next week to do this. There will be an outage while this is done. If there is something wrong with the recloser, the cost would be approximately \$200. plus parts.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have a qualified Engineer for Sub-Stations be present at the Inspection of the Sub-Station. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Marlin Bower had ask to have his driveway fixed. It seems that his house was built lower than the road bed and he has a problem with water running into his garage. Before any blading is done, an agreement should be reached between Raymond Stewart and Mr. Bower. If they can agree where the tube is to be placed so that it would benefit both.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have Marlin Bower pay for the tube and labor if he wants to make improvements to his driveway, with the understanding that Raymond Stewart will be contacted and in agreement of how the drainage will affect him. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Keith Westphal had ask about getting water into his building. Originally the water was put into the old Ahrens building and then taken across each building. There has always been a problem with the Water line freezing. The east building is to be capped and shut off, and the City men will dig down from the highway side to install the water into Keith Westphal's brick building. He is to pay the \$250. hook up fee plus labor and materials.

The County Auditor had ask that several street be closed and also some of the alleys. This would be particularly in Arnold's Addition to the City of Fontanelle. Specifically the alley across Block 17, 18, 19, and 20. Also the alley in Block 7. 11th Street between Block 18 & 19. 10th Street between Block 17 & 18; and 12th Street between Block 19 & 20. Since the legal procedure is not known at this time, it was decided to table the matter until a more specific decision could be reached, and this would have to be turned over to an attorney to make out the proper proceedings.

The Clerk had given the Council examples of three different Ordinances regarding Exotic Animals. The Council felt they needed more time to thoroughly study each Ordinance and will be working on this in the future.

Council Member Gene Jacobsen introduced a Resolutuion entitled "RESOLUTION Adopting Rates For Electricity Purchased From Alternate Energy Producers by the Fontanelle Municipal Utilities" and moved for its adoption. Council Member Robert Edwards seconded the motion to adopt. The Mayor ask for a roll call, and the following voted:

AYE: Harold Veatch, Denny Sickles, Kenneth Perry, Robert Edwards and Gene Jacobsen. NAY: None.

Whereupon, the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING RATES FOR ELECTRICITY PURCHASED FROM ALTERNATE ENERGY PRODUCERS BY THE FONTANELLE MUNICIPAL UTILITIES.

WHEREAS, the Iowa State Commerce Commission has required electric utilities to file tariffs establishing rates for purchases of electricity from qualifying alternate energy producers and small hydro facilities; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa:

That, to the extent such purchases are allowed under legally binding contracts between the utility and its wholesale supplier(s), the utility will purchase electricity from qualifying alternate energy producers and small hydro facilities or will transmit the electricity to another utility;

That in accordance with rules adopted by the Iowa State Commerce Commission (250 IAC Chapter 15), the rate for such purchases will be \$.015/kWh

That the rate tariff will become effective thirty days after filing with the Commission;

That public notice of the rate adopted herein shall be by publication of this resolution in the newspaper of record.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Denny Sickles, Kenneth Perry, Robert Edwards and Harold Veatch. Absent: Gene Jacobsen.

Motion by Harold Veatch to approve the application of Barbara Hill dba "The Town Pump" for a Liquor License with Sunday Sales. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the application for a Cigarette Permit for Barbara Hill dba "The Town Pump". Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to refund Darrell Dodge dba ~~Dodgers Bar & Grill~~ the Liquor License due from the City in the amount of \$97.50 as set out by the State Liquor Commission. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

There was a lengthy discussion about Electricity. Delmer Miller reported that the city does have some #6 wire on hand for overhead lines. We said the City also has poles, cross-arms and insulators. The tie in would be at the Ronald Purdy residence and to east to the R.E.C.'s underground south of the Marion Faurote residence at the first corner west of Greenfield. A meter would have to be installed so that the City would be billed and the R.E.C. would get credit for the Electricity used.

It was decided that Delmer Miller and Robert Edwards should look into the cost of both underground and overhead to see which was most feasible.

Delmer Miller had talked to Solomon Electric Co. regarding the Transformer, and was told that they will rewind the Westinghouse Transformer if the City would buy the wire.

The Council discussed the Electrical outage of November 19th caused by Albert Eshelman's cutting through the cable with a tiling machine. They felt that a bill should be sent to Mr. Eshelman to cover the expense of the men who worked repairing the damage.

The furnace and the breakers are to be checked at the Community Center as they are not working properly.
