Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Bonnie Burg met with the Council to discuss minors playing pool and ask that the Council lower the age limit so that 13 and 14 year olds could play pool. It was pointed out to Mrs. Burg that the Iowa State Code Chapter 233.1 Paragraph 2 states that no child under 18 is allowed to play pool where beer is sold, and the fine for allowing them to play is \$100. or 30 days in jail or both.

Delmer Miller had done some inquiring as to the damage to the cable being hit by a tiling machine. He had ask some lawyers and was told that if the City had paid an easement and unless there was a specific rule on signs that the City has a good case. There would be an approximate cost of \$120. for a lawyer, or it could be taken to small claims court.

Motion by Denny Sickles to notify Albert Eshelman that according to all legal sources that he is responsible for the payment of the bill. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Delmer Miller also stated that a Valve Box locator was needed. The City always has to borrow one from Greenfield to locate some of the 4" valves that can not be located.

Motion by Denny Sickles to buy a Magnetic Locator from Water Products Co. for the quoted price of \$585.00. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Chief Ronald Highland gave two quotes on a new police car, from Charles Gabus Ford Co. in Des Moines. It was decided to get one with the larger motor, with some of the other options deleted.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to buy a new 4 door Ford Crown Victoria "S" Police Car. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Zane Blessman of the Don Carlos Law Firm met with the Council to get approval of a plat for the Ed and Mary Glade Property so that a clear title could be given to the buyer.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Glade Sub-division plat presented by Attorney Zane Blessman. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

The Budget for the ensuing year was reviewed and discussed.

The Council approved for filing and publication the proposed budget, and fixed the time and place for the public hearing on March 4, 1985 at 8:00 p.m.. The Clerk was directed to publish the required notices and estimate summary as required by law.

Council Member Kenneth Perry reintroduced the Ordinance on Exotic Animals for its second consideration for approval. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

The Enterprise Club had informed the Council that they were entering the Iowa Community Betterment Program and ask that a representative of the City be named from the Council.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to appoint Denny Sickles to the Iowa Community Betterment Program as a representative for the City. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

The City had received notice from Southern Iowa Regional Housing Authority that it shall appoint a new representative to serve on that board for a period of three years. Loyal Goff had been serving in that capacity but resigned due to the fact that much of the time they were traveling. Keith Westphal also declined when ask to take the appointment. It was decided to contact Harvey Wallace, Mike Cass or Ronald Purdy. However, when ask Mr. Wallace declined because of his work at the bank, insurance business, income tax and the many meetings that he has to attend.

The Clerk had taken names of those interested in cleaning the Community Center. The list of names consisted of Mrs. Mike Sickles, Mrs. Bill Blazek, Mrs. Robert Jacobson, Valerie Edwards, Mrs. Gene Larson, Mrs. Mick Baudler, Mrs. Virgil Swanson and Mrs. Dennis Johnson.

Motion by Harold Veatch to hire Valerie Edwards to clean the Community Center as needed at the rate of \$3.50 per hour. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to adjourn. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.
