Motion by Kenneth Perry to have the City Attorney get proceedings ready to vacate some streets and alleys! Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported that there is to be a meeting at Creston Central Iowa Power Co-op at 7:00 p.m. on April 8th to meet with the group of SIMECA members. He ask that the Mayor and some of the Council Members attend.

The Transformers are back and in place but are not hooked up. It was suggested that wires should be made up for the Spare Transformer, so that it could be hooked up without delay.

Delmer had received information about a truck at ABM Equipment in Minnesota. After some discussion it was decided that if it was in good condition that the City would consider buying it.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have Delmer Miller, Robert Edwards and Harold Veatch look at the used Utility truck and if satisfactory to purchase it. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

The County will be doing some road work. It was decided that the City would have that crew re-do the portion of 1st Street from Washington Street to the Railroad track in the north part of town.

Mildred Zimmerline wants rock in her alley and Gene Smith wants his street oiled to keep down dust. Albert Mensing also has been told to clean up the junk at the northwest corner of the square.

Delmer also reported that the 1st cell of the Lagoon needs cleaning. This could be done in July or August. He was to ask Charles Cummins about the price, or signing a contract to do the work, whichever is cheaper.

There was discussion about selling the International Cub Cadet Lawn Mower. Delmer Miller offered the Council \$200. for the lawn mower.

Motion by Robert Edwards to sell Delmer Miller the old Cub Cadet Lawn Mower for \$200. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to send a letter to Forcht Construction regarding the settlement on the Fire Station Project. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

154 Chief Ronald Highland reported that he needed "door Emblems" for the City Police Car and also wanted non reflective 2 inch stripes down the side of the Car. These could be gotten from Newton Sales. He also suggested that the car be taken to Ziebart for the complete undercoating.

Lester Elliott had ask that a 20 foot section of driveway tubing put in at his driveway so that he could have room to turn into his drive. The tube is to be paid for by Mr. Elliott.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have C.R. O. Satellite Co. send an "As Constructed" plat of the Cable T. V. installation for the proper procedure of locating the wires. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to retain a new Legal Counsel in lieu of the present Legal Council as of May 1st, 1985. Attorney Zane Blessman will be the new City Attorney replacing Don Mackaman. This is to be for an indefinite period.

Motion by Harold Veatch that only by City Council approval will any tables be rented from the Community Center and if any table is returned damaged it is to be replaced by the Organization responsible. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Spraying and refurbishing the City Park was discussed. The Council made calls as to find out what chemicals were to be applied. Two bids had been received. One from Funke Landscaping and the other from Rabe Turf Service. It was decided that Rabe Turf Service would do the work as Funke was just one application, and Rabe had a choice of 5. Due to the fact that there are always children playing in the park it was decided not to apply the insecticide in the second application.

Motion by Denny Sickles to adjourn. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.
