## ORDINANCE NO. 121

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHARGES, CONDITIONS, AND OTHER TERMS OF OFFERING IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ELECTRIC SERVICE TARIFF AND ADOPTING SOUCH TARIFF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iwwa:

Section 1. PURPOSE It is the purpose of this Ordinance to adopt the Electric Tariff No. 3 as of this date and to be effective on July 20, 1985, to authorize fileing of same with the Iowa State Commerce Commission and to establish charges, conditions, and other terms of offering to be in effect in conjunction with said electric service tariff of the Fontanelle Municipal Utility. Charges, terms and conditions established by this Ordinance are subject to other such conditions and stipulations

as may be required by the electric service tariff.

Section 2. SECURITY LIGHTS. In conjunction In conjunction with Section 2.4(5) of the electric service tariff, the City will provide a security light at no charge or a lawn light at 50% of cost. The City will charge for any labor and materials required other than the light itself.

Section 3. SEASONAL. In conjunction with Section 2.4(6) of the electric service tariff, the charge per month per transformer KVA installed shall be <u>\$.075</u>.
