Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported that there was an IAMU meeting to be held in Des Moines on Sept. 8th through 10th that he would like to attend.

Street project is done by the Fort Dodge Asphalt and they are now just finishing driveways and parking lots that people had ask them to do. The ditch on the North side of Ervin Queck's property has been completed. Delmer thinks that the water can be turned so that it won't be necessary to put in a drop.

Delmer also reported that the Commerce Commission had done an electrical inspection such as guy wires, house connections and pole replacements.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to send Delmer Miller to the IAMU meeting in Des Moines and to pay his registration and expenses. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Delmer informed the Council that he would be pumping from the deep well starting Wednesday, August 6th, while they are cleaning the pits at the treatment plant. He thinks this will take at least 3 days, and after that is done they will be flushing mains. He is putting a notice in the paper to this effect.

At 8:00 o'clock a hearing was held on vacating certain streets and alleys. Notice of the hearing had been published in the Fontanelle Observer. City Attorney A. Zane Blessum attended the hearing. Mrs. Blythe Rodgers attended the hearing saying that she was very interested in buying half of the alley. Gene Smith requested that the center of the road is to stay where it is now, and in later years he did not want anything taken off of his land in case the street was changed in any way. He ask that the Council adopt a provision that definitely established that center point of the street.

After hearing those present the Mayor ask if there were any more objections, stating that the final decision would be made at the September 3rd meeting. Attorney Blessum will contact the State Dept. of Transportation regarding if the State had any objections.

Delmer assured the ladies that the filters were cleaned every morning and that the iron content of the water was .1 to .2 parts per million.

Motion by Robert Edwards to get a specialist to come and evaluate the water and get an answer to solving the problem. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Council Member Gene Jacobsen introduced a resolution entitled "Resolution Approving Financial report for Municipal Street and Parking for the City of Fontanelle for the year 1984/85" and moved for its adoption. The Mayor informed the Council that there was a new ruling on stray or picked up dogs. They are to be taken to Greenfield to the Veterinary and he will take care of them for 7 days, at the cost of \$2.00 per day. Whoever claims the dog will have to pay the complete bill. If no one claims the dog within that time it will be given away to someone wanting it or will be put to sleep. If the dog has to be destroyed, the City is responsible for the bill.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to take all dogs that are picked up to Greenfield to the veterinarian to be held for a seven day period at the cost of \$2.00 per day. Whoever claims the dog will be responsible for paying the cost but if the dog is not claimed or given away and has to be destroyed the town will pay the cost. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to buy a gas meter for \$75. to be installed at the Community Center. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to buy a new mop bucket for the Community Center. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

There have been complaints about Police Chief Dan Richards. It seems a lot of time is spent in the Tavern and some have reported that he has been playing cards. Dan told the Council that he had some time coming and that when he was in the tavern playing cards he was on his own time and not in uniform, and when he is not on duty he is always on call and the Sheriff is notified.

Deputy Kelly Critz has served his 60 days temporary employment and he plans to move to Fontanelle the last week in August. He does have good backing from the Sheriff's department.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to put Kelly Critz on a 40 hour week schedule at the rate of \$4.25 per hour. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.
