Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported on the meeting on Hydro Electric Power that he, the Mayor and Council Members Harold Veatch and Denny Sickles attended in Dennison. He ask that Petitions be signed. Everyone should write to their Congressmen. He ask that a meeting with M.B.P.A. be set up in the very near future and that the public be informed as to what it could mean if the Power Marketing Agencies were sold to private companies.

Delmer also reported that the water plant has been cleaned and that they will be flushing mains.

Dale Sickles, Fire Chief, reported that Greenfield has a tanker truck that they will be getting rid of. They has some pumping equipment on the truck and ask \$300 for the equipment. He also stated that if the Department gets the truck that the tables would have to be moved from the Fire Station and he ask if a building could be put on the south side of the Fire Station to accomodate the tables. The Lumber Yard has a building for \$995. without a front door. This will be taken up at the next Fire and Rescue Committee Meeting.

Repairs for the push mower have not been found. It was decided that a new one might as well be bought where we could get service and repairs.

The Frank Martin Family had ask for Council approval to having some trees planted in the park in memory of Mr. Martin. The Council approved this and suggested that 3 or 4 trees would be fine.

A letter was received from Dennis & Becky Denton regarding an annual 199 Adair County Bike Ride, of which they are chair persons. This ride is to be held on June 21. They ask that civic organizations and church groups be aware of their project, as they will be needing food and drink stands along their way.

City Attorney A. Zane Blessum met with the Council. He had been in contact with the head of the railroad, and it is decided that the 3rd street bridge will remain but the 4th street bridge is to be removed and the road replaced. The railroad will give some money toward the reestablishment of the street.

Mr. Blessum also reported on the several properties that are to be cleaned up around town. Mayor Means designated the week of April 14th to be clean up week for the entire town.

Casey's General Store presented a plan for expansion and ask for approval of a building permit.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the building permit for Casey's General Stores for expansion. Seconded by Bob Edwards. Carried.

Trees at the Iva Rechtenbach residence that are on the parking need topping of the dead wood. She got an estimate of \$300. from David Bathurst, and ask if the town would be willing to pay one-half the cost.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to pay for one-half the cost of trimming the trees an Iva Rechtenbach's parking. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Mike Cass president of the Enterprise Club brought plans for the park equipment for the Council to approve. These will be put up later and it was from a 4-H Grant that was received by a local youth.

There was discussion with Police Chief Dan Richards. Many complaints had been recieved because of his being unavailable, especially when needed. The Mayor instructed the police to keep the car parked in the city garage when not on duty, and not on the street or at the residence of the Police.

Motion by Bob Edwards to have the Police car parked in the City Garage at night. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

There was discussion about a raise in the wages of Kelly Critz deputy policeman, since he has graduated from the Law Enforcement Academy. Since no decision could be made it was tabled until a later date.

Officer Dan Richards ask the Council if the restrooms in the park should be opened now that warmer weather is here. It was decided to have them opened.

There is to be a Tornado awareness program at the Bridgewater school and both policemen would like to attend. Permission was given.

Six applications were reviewed for the job of cleaning city hall and the community center. Those making applications were: Edgar Frank, Keri Sickles, Alice Blazek, Darcy Rice, Jackie Veatch and Diana Jacobsen

Motion by Kenneth Perry to hire Diana Jacobson to clean City Hall and the Community Center at the rate of \$3.50 per hour. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to notify people that no dogs are allowed in the City Park. Seconded by Bob Edwards. Carried.

The Rebekahs had ask to rent the Community Center for their meetings and ask if a table could be left their. They hold their meetings twice a month. The Council ask about the size of the table due to the room it would take up for other people. It was decided to give them permission to use the center at the same price established for everyone to pay.

Motion by Harold Veatch to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
