202 David Dinkel met with the Council regarding the painting of the sign for the Community Center. After much discussion it was decided to paint a sign on a 12'x2" board with a white background and brown lettering stating FONTANELLE COMMUNITY CENTER. This is to have a brick molding frame. The Mayor ask for approval for painting City Hall <sup>or window</sup> Motion by Denny Sickles to have David Dinkel paint the signs for the Community Center and the City Hall Window. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Since the resignation of Kelly Critz as a police officer and has gone to Adams County Sheriff's Department the Council and Mayor discussed what possiblities there would be in filling the Department. The Mayor is to talk to the supervisors to see if there is a possibility of the County covering the work. With most police officers being sent to the Academy by the city and then leaving in a short time; the Council felt that if another man was hired it would be better to get one that already had academy training.

Bob Pringle of Mid State Engineering met with the Council regarding the Water Project. He suggested that a pre-application be sent to FmHA to fund the project if the O.P.P. Grant doesn't come through. He also suggested that the city could look into the possibility of going with the Rural Water System.

Helen Wyllie and Zura Brown representing the Cora Rebekah Lodge met with the Council regarding their renting of the Community Center for their meetings which are held the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month. They felt that \$15. was to much when they just use it for an hour, and they needed a place to store their altars and pedestals. The Council said that they were welcome to use it, but the price would have to be the same and that there is definitely no room to store their things. The Mayor did tell them that they were most welcome to use it for special occasions if the need arises.

Daryl Kline met with the Council wanting approval to install a tube for drainage and to do some discing between his property and that of Fred Zimmerline. He also ask to have the alley graveled between his property and that of Ardell Griffith. The Council gave its approval on all matters with Mr. Kline paying for the materials.

Delmer Miller reported that in the near future all electrical meters will be checked by Chapman Metering Service of Jefferson, Iowa.

Dan Richards reported that there have been many complaints about the driving habits of Matt Baudler causing some near accidents. However, when the police car is spotted, he does not drive in an erratic manner. Plans are to visit with family member's warning of the danger. Some of the complaints are received by those who do not want to get involved.

The Clerk informed the Council that there is to be a Clerk's workshop in Corning on May 21st.

Motion by Denny Sickles to send Evelyn Rohner and Lois Ehrenfried to Corning to the Clerk's Workshop and to pay for the registration. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Estimates were reviewed from Rohlin Construction. It was felt that there was a mix up on the location and that more information was needed before they would consider black-topping 1st Street. It was decided to have a meeting later to get this problem solved.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to make a \$200. donation to the B-F Pre-School to help pay for thier insurance. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

James Jensen would pay for the cement for his new sidewalk if the city would put in the forms and level it. It was decided that the City Crew is much to busy to take time to do this with the street project, water problems and the Lutheran Church drainage problem.

The Council decided that due to Mr. Frisbies not co-operating with the code about keeping sidewalks clear that they would ask to have an Ordinance made up with a stiff fine for those disobeying the order. This will be turned over to the Attorney to be made up.

A lot of complaints about people burning garbage have been received. If this continues there will be a letter sent to those doing the burning stating the provisions of the State Code of Iowa.

Harold Veatch gave a report on how much dirt it would take to fill the gap when the east railroad bridge is removed. It would take 3,555 cubic yards of dirt and would cost approximately \$14,000.

Motion by Denny Sickles to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
