Departmental Reports were heard and correspondence read.

There was considerable discussion about the performance of Policeman Dan Richards. He was ask to present his daily logs for confirmation of time spent on duty. He was reminded again by Councilman Veatch to not have any riders in the car while he was on duty.

Pastor Harold McMillen and several of the vestry met with the Council regarding the water drainage problem at the Lutheran Church. Those besides Rev. McMillen were: Carl Schwartz, Larry Hohertz and Merle Held. They related that surface water was coming down through the tile and was backing up into the northeast room in the basement of the church. They said when the heavy rains come the pipe is unable to handle it. Delmer figured that a total of 400' of tubing was needed. The City had put in 40 feet of 12 inch plastic today. Delmer had looked up the price of tubing and found that 12" cost \$2.30 per ft., 15" cost \$3.25 per foot and 18" cost \$5.30 per foot. No decision was reached on this problem.

Motion by Robert Edwards to find out who owns the tile at the Church. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

There was discussion about the Cable T. V. It has been scrambled on the Showtime Channel for some time. Delmer Miller has tried to call the company several times, but has not been able to find out what the problem is. A de-scrambler is supposed to be in place in the building owned by the Company. It was suggested that the officials of the company should meet with the City Council at their next regular meeting.

Motion by Denny Sickles to approve the Agenda as posted. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the bill to pay Rohlin Construction the full amount of \$23,608.11 for street resurfacing of 1st Street from Maple Street north to the railroad track, where the County project ends. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Motion by Denny Sickles to pay David Bathurst \$225.00 for topping trees adjoining the Iva Rechtenbach property. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

There was discussion about the railroad bridge and police protection. It was stated that Policeman Dan Richards has a weeks vacation time coming. Since there was no written contract or written papers the Council felt that it would be in the best interest of everyong if he was dismissed from duty. The sheriff will do his best to cover situations until someone is hired.

Pastor Harold McMillen had expressed interest in setting up a neighborhood watch. He would like to discuss the matter with the Council, perhaps at a later date.

The Council decided that if a new policeman can be found that if he has not been academy trained he would have to work a year before sending him to the academy.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to give Dan Richards a 2 weeks notice and to give him the option to resign. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Also discussed wqs the drainage problem at the Lutheran Church. According to the minutes of 1948 (Page 302 & 306) the town and the church share on an equal basis the establishing and maintaing of a waterway throu the property and the town reserved the right to enter the property, without liability, for the purpose of repair and maintenance of the above mentioned waterway. This waterway was established to take care of the surface water.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means, presiding. Council Members present were: Kenneth Perry, Robert Edwards, Harold Veatch and Gene Jacobsen

The purpose of the meeting was to interview Lawrence Guthrie who had applied for the job as policeman.

Mr. Lawrence ask what the hours would be and what benefits were available. He ask about clothes and equipment that are furnished and vacation. He was certified at the academy in December 1985, 36 years old, married and has a family of 3 sons. He would be willing to move to Fontanelle and would like the lawyer to draw up a contract for 2 years. He presented a complete file of his academy training where he scored a grade point average of 90.21

Motion by Harold Veatch to hire Lawrence Guthrie on a trial basis at \$15,000. per year with 50 hours per work week, to start July 1, 1986. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.
