Departmental Reports were heard and correspondence read.

Chief Lawrence Guthrie informed the Council that the car needs new tires and that it needs a tune-up as it is hard to start. It also needs a wheel bearing and the chrome trim had been damaged by hail. Above the left door the paint is peeling. He also ask for a new siren control, a law book holder and a new light bar. He needs a new duty belt and said that the gun was unservicable. He plans to move to Fontanelle about August 10th and wants the Council to consider getting a pager. The Flashlight battery pack is shot and needs a new switch and the spot light doesn't work.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to get 2 new tires and get the car fixed. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to buy a light bar, switch, spot light, flashlight and belt for the police. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

David Jungman met with the Council regarding an Ordinance and the Railroad Bridge that is to be removed. He thought a change in the wording of the Ordinance was needed. This would be included in the code under Chapter 9; Title 6; regarding sidewalks. He was representing Zane Blessum the regular city attorney. Mr. Blessum will talk to the Supt. of the railroad (Mr. DeWaele.) and see what their contract reads as to the removal of the bridge. The Council decided to go with a 30" pipe before any dirt can be replaced.

Cable T.V. was discussed being as Great Plains Cable Co. plans to raise the monthly bill on basic and premium channels.

The Clerk had been advised by the Telephone Company that they were not getting enough revenue from the phone booth and that if the City wanted to keep it they would have to pay \$50. per month to keep it in the City park.

Motion by Harold Veatch to have the Phone Booth removed from the City Park since the Telephone Co. ask that the city pay \$50. per month to have it remain. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Chief Guthrie informed the Council that he would have to take a MMPI test which is required by the state. The City's cost would be \$44.05.

Motion by Denny Sickles to have Lawrence Guthrie take the MMPI test as required by the State. Seconded by Harold Veatch. Carried.

Members of the Lutheran Church Vestry met with the Council regarding the drainage problem. They had contacted Cummins Construction and he proposed to run a 12" line intersecting with an 8" line and going through Steve Marckmann's property to get more fall. The estimated cost would be from \$1800 to \$2000. It was decided that the old line would be taken care of by the City and the new line to be taken care of by the Church.

Delmer Miller stated that the City needs a new small chain saw and he would like a Homelite. Prices vary from \$115 to \$145.

Motion by Robert Edwards to buy a Homelite Chain Saw. Seconded by Denny Sickles. Carried.

Delmer also reported that one of the Sewer pumps is not working and the cost of having it rebuilt is \$2700. This is guaranteed for 1 year. The one in operation has a noise in it. Delmer wants to get a price from a Company in Omaha. If the old one is fixed no plumbing would be needed but a new one might need some other plumbing done. It was decided by the Council that if the price was within reason that Delmer should get a new pump rather than pay \$2700 for the repairs.

Delmer reported that there was hail damage to the roof and some of the windows due to last weeks storm. The Insurance Co. should pay part of it. An adjuster is to come in a week or so.

Delmer reported that a man from the Commerce Commission was here recently. We are to turn in an inspection report on inspection of the lines. Each pole is to be sound tested. He inspected a portion of the poles and said that all inspected things were to be fixed within one year

An Electrical Engineer (Dave Devries) was supposed to meet with the Council at this meeting but will set up a Special Meeting later in the month due to the fact that he could not be here tonight.

Motion by Harold Veatch to approve the following members for the Library Board for a term of 6 years. Those members being Frances Gross (reappointed) and Betty Burcham as a new member. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.
