Such expense shall be audited and determined by the council, and if not paid within thirty days of billing the owner responsible, the costs shall be assessed against such lots and parcels as a lien, and shall be certified by the clerk to the county auditor, and shall be collected in the same manner as general property taxes.

6-9.04 DISPLAYING WARES. All business owners shall not exhibit wares or merchandise beyond three (3) feet from the front or face of their place of business.

6-9.05 PENALTY. Any person violating Section 6-9.04 of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding \$100.00. Each day of the continuance of such violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

CONCURRENT NOTICENOTICE TO PUBLIC OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC OF REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

The City of Fontanelle, City Hall, Fontanelle, Iowa, Telephone (515) 745-3961, will request from the Iowa Department of Economic Development to release federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (P.L. 97-35), for the following project:

PROJECT TITLE: Fontanelle City Water System Improvement Program.

NATURE OF PROJECT: To renovate the city's water system including constructing a 100,000 gallon water tower, renovating the water treatment plant and constructing a new water sewer with connecting pipe.

LOCATION OF PROJECT: City of Fontanelle, Iowa.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of human environment and accordingly the City of Fontanelle, Iowa has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190)

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such statement are as follows:

No adverse impacts on the environment will occur as a result of this project. Furthermore, no negative effects are anticipated during construction beyond short term construction noise and dust.

222 An Environmental Review Record respecting this project has been made by the above-named City which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying upon request ~~###~~ ~~#####~~ at the Office of the City Clerk between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Fontanelle to the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Fontanelle, Iowa. Such written comments should be received at the Office of the City Clerk on or before October, 23, 1986. All such comments so received will be considered and the City will not request the release of CDBG funds or take any administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

The City of Fontanelle, Iowa will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the Department of Economic Development under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The City of Fontanelle, Iowa and Ralph Means, in his official capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if any action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval the City of Fontanelle, Iowa may use the Block Grant funds and IDEED will have satisfied its responsibilities under the Environmental Policy Act of 1969. IDEED will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer, or (b) that the applicant's environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24CFR Par 58) and may be addressed to IDEED, Division of Local Government Affairs, 200 East Grand Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa 50319.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by IDEED. No objections received after November 12, 1986 will be considered by IDEED.
