His estimate of cost of tying in with Greenfield was approximatel 255 \$39,500. \$25,000 for materials, \$4,100 for Labor, \$6500 for metering and 3800 for Engineering. He stressed very strongly that this would be a weak link and would possibly not be able to carry the load of the town especially at a peak season or when corn drying was being done. Contracts with Western Area Power Administration and SIMECA would have

to be revised and new contracts with Greenfield or REC would have to be made He felt that to build another circuit from the present Sub-Station would be the most feasible way to go, although it would be somewhat more expensive. He estimated \$46,400 for materials, \$9500 for Labor and \$3800 for Engineering for a total cost of \$59,600. He thought the best idea was to put the wire in the ditch or on the shoulder of the road. with a 20 or 30 feet separation between the circuits. He thought that it was such a small project that contractors would not be to interested. It could be mapped out in 1 or 2 days. Trenching and splicing would be under \$10,000. Jacketed cable should be used with a ground about 4 times per mile. He suggested that he bring Mr. Ben Brink down to look over the digging project.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to have Ben Brink of Dewild Grant Reckert come down and see if the electric line can be dug in on the side of the road. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Harold Veatch to adjourn. Seconded by Robert Edwards.
