SECTION 2. DISEASED TREES. The openburning of diseased trees causes a nuisance appropriate of diseased trees causes and diseased trees causes an However, when the burning of diseased trees causes a nuisance appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of the burning operation.

Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite diseased trees.

SECTION 3. FLARE STACKS. The open burning or flaring of waste gases, provided such open burning or flaring is conducted in compliance with applicable rules of the state department of environmental quality.

SECTION 4. LANDSCAPE WASTE. The disposal by open burning of land-scape waste originating on the premises. However, the burning of landscape waste produced in clearing, grubbing and construction operations shall be limited to areas located at least one-fourth $(\frac{1}{4})$ mile from any inhabited building. Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite landscape waste.
