ORDINANCE No. 125 ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III, CHAPTER 4, PARAGRAPH 3-4.0105 TO THE CITY CODE OF FONTANELLE, IOWA

3-4.0105. OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials, except that the following shall be permitted.

The open burning of rubbish, including Section 1. DIBASTER RUBBISH.

landscape waste, for the furation of the community disaster period in cases where an officially declared emergency condition exists.

Section 2. DISEASED TREES. The open burning of diseased trees
However, when the burning of diseased trees causes a nuisance appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of the burning operation.

Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite diseased trees.

Section 3. FLARE STACKS. The open burning or flaring of waste gases, provided such open burning or flaring is conducted in compliance

with applicable rules of the state department of environmental quality.

Section 4. LANDSCAPE WASTE. The disposal by open burning of landscape waste originating on the premises. However, the burning of landscape waste produced in clearing, grubbing and construction operations
shall be limited to areas located at least one-fourth (1/4) mile from any inhabited building. Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite landscape waste. However, buring of landscape waste shall only be permitted from October 1 through May 31 and when such burning causes a nuisance, appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of the burning operation.

Section 5. Recreational Fires Open fires for cooking, heating, recreation and ceremonies, provided they comply with the limits for emmission of visible air contaminants established by the state department

of environmental quality.

Section 6. BACK YARD BURNING. Back yard burning of resident waste at dwellings of four-family units or less. However, if such Back yard burning of residential burning of residential waste causes a nuisance, appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of burning operation. All back yyard burning shall be done within the confines of an appropriate burn resistant container and covered by steel mesh, screen or aerated lid to

reduce flying debris.
Section 7. TRAI TRAINING FIRES. Fires set for the purpose of bona fide training of public or industrial employees in fire fighting methods, provided that the executive director of the state department of environmental quality receives notice in writing at least one week before

such action commences.

Any person wishing to conduct open burning of Section 8. VARIANCE. materials not exempted herein may make application for a variance to the executive director of the state department of environmental quality.
