Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported that the pump is pumping 75 gallon per minute for 20 to 24 hours a day. He is sure that there is a leak and thought that a Leak Consultant should be brought in to find the problem.

Motion by Gene J cobsen to have a Leak Consultant come in to find the water leak. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Chief LaBrec stated that he needs 2 new all-season tires for the front of the Police Car.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to buy 2 new all-season front tires for the Police Car at the quoted price of 51.79 each from the Farmer's Co-op. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve building permits for Robert Edwards for a house extension, Tom & Evelyn Purdy for a house extension and to George Gross for a basement and extension to his house. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Robert Edwards to approve the application for a cigarette permit for Mary A. Edquist dba "The Loft". Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the following people to serve on the Election Board for the City Election to be held November 3: Keith Westpha Henry Hyda, Virgil Martin, Marlene Thompson and Ruth Menefee. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Robert Edwards to approve Draw Down #10 in the amount of \$9,878.14 from the Iowa Department of Economic Development. The City share to be paid will be \$4,714.60.. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the bill to Scheck's Plumbing and Heating in the amount of \$3,624.25. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Gene Jacobsen introduced the ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III, CHAPTER 4, PARAGRAPH 3-4.0105 TO THE CITY CODE OF FONTANELLE for its seconded consideration. The third and final reading will be at the November 2, meeting

3-4.0105. OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials, except that the following shall be permitted.

Section 1. DISASTER RUBBISH. The open burning of rubbish, including landscape waste, for the duration of the community disaster period in cases where an officially declared emergency condition exists.

Section 2. DISEASED TREES. The open burning of diseased trees. However, when the burning of diseased trees causes a nuisance appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of the burning operation. Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite diseased trees.

Section 3. FLARE STACKS. The open burning or flaring of waste gases, provided such open burning or flaring is conducted in compliance with applicable rules of the state department of environmental quality.

Section 4. LANDSCAPE WASTE. The disposal by open burning of landscape waste originating on the premises. However, the burning of landscape waste produced in clearing, grubbing and construction operations shall be limited to areas located at least one-fourth ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) mile from any inhabited building. Rubber tires shall not be used to ignite landscape waste. However, burning of landscape waste shall only be permitted from October 1 through May 31 and when such burning causes a nuisance, appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of the burning operation.

Section 5. Recreational Fires Open fires for cooking, heating, recreation and ceremonies, provided they comply with the limits for emission of visible air contaminants established by the state department of environmental quality.


Section 6. BACK YARD BURNING. Back yard burning of residential waste at dwellings of four-family units or less. However, if such burning of residential waste causes a nuisance, appropriate action may be taken to require relocation of burning operation. All back yard burning shall be done within the confines of an appropriate burn resistant container and covered by steel mesh, screen or aerated lid to reduce flying debris.

Section 7. TRAINING FIRES. Fires set for the purpose of bona fide training of public or industrial employees in fire fighting methods, provided that the executive director of the state department of environmental quality receives notice in writing at least one week before such action commences.

Section 8. VARIANCE. Any person wishing to conduct open burning of materials not exempted herein may make application for a variance to the executive director of the state department of environmental quality.

In other business, Gene Purdy presented a petition regarding a vicious dog that belongs to Tim Wambold. He stated that the dog could get as far as the middle of the street even though it is on a chain. He felt that children would not have a chance if the dog would attack them. During his talk with the Council Mrs. Lois Wood came in to report that she had just walked by the residence of Mr. Wambold and that the dog came after her. If she had not jumped <sup>to the side</sup> she would have been bitten. Officer LaBrec was notified to contact Mr. Wambold immediately to get the problem solved.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
