

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer Miller reported that the Leak Location Consultants had only found 5 small leaks and that he may pressure test some of the plastic lines.

John Potts of Mid State Engineering met with the Council. He reported that Northway was basically finished. There was one change order to add to their bill, making their total bill \$23,805.31.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve Change Order #1 in the amount of \$860.56 to Northway Well Co. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve payment to Northway Well Co in the amount of \$21,833.14. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Robert Edwards to approve payment to Weidner Excavating in the amount of \$2090. for repairs to the plant. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve Change Orders #1 and 2 to contract with Scheck's Plumbing & Heating for 4 services and 10' boring. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the bill of Mid State Engineering in the amount of \$711.57. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Robert Edwards to approve the Mayor's signing the Draw Down and quarterly report presented by Southern Iowa Council of Governments. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

There is to be an area meeting of Iowa Association of Municipal Utilities to be held at the Atlantic Country Club on November 17th. Mayor and Council are to let Delmer Miller know how many will attend by Nov. 15th.

Gary Queck met with the Council to inform them that he was resigning his job as part time policeman. He thanked the Council for giving him the opportunity to work for them and to further his experience in law enforcement. He turned in his keys, badge and equipment. He ask to buy a belt, flashlight holder and shell holder that was spare equipment from other officers.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to sell a belt, flashlight holder and shell holder to Gary Queck for \$35.00. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to pay the Posse (Adair County Sheriff Reserves) \$50.00 for their help during Halloween weekend. Seconded by Robert Edwards. Carried.

Chief LaBrec commented that the young people of Fontanelle were excellent and did no damage to any property over Halloween and that he was very proud of the Fontanelle youth.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the building permit of Ivan Eighmy to move in a mobile home. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Robert Edwards to approve the building permit of Al Mensing to expand his garage at his residence. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the building permit of Fred Burcham for a shed as long as it is not in the alley. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Delano Chafa met with the Council. He said as long as the town was going down hill he would like to see the Council try to get some businesses to come to town. He suggested that they write to WAL MART Corp to see if they would put in a Mini Mart. He also suggested that The City purchase a 100 to 150 KW generator to use when the electricity was off. He stated that CAT has they for \$3,000 to \$4,000.

The Christmas Party was discussed and it was decided that it would be held December 12th.

The City Council Met in Special Session at the City Hall at 5:00 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Robert Edwards, Kenneth Perry, Harold Veatch, Denny Sickles and Gene Jacobsen. Absent: None.

John Potts of Mid State Engineering stated that the completion date for the water plant was going to have to be extended. The pressure filter had been delayed but that it is in now and that all he has left to do is the floor of the plant. Weidner had asked for the extension, as he has the sludge pump and columns and drain to put in.

284 Motion by Denny Sickles to extend the Weidner contract date to January 1988. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Delmer Miller stated that they were not satisfied with the output of the old pump on the deep well. It seemed not to be able to keep up with the demand. He had pulled the pump and sent it in for repair. They had taken off one stage, brought back a new pump but it didn't pump any more water than the old one. They test the well on open discharge at 100 gallons per minute so they knew the well was all right. Delmer ask if the Council wanted to spend \$5500 for a new pump that would pump 78 gallons per minutes or a 20 horse that would pump 120 gallons per minute that would cost \$4208. After much discussion the Council thought it would be better to repair the old pump.

Motion by Harold Veatch to repair the old pump and put it back in the well. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
