Departmental Reports were heard and correspondence read.
 Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to send Delmer Miller to the Iowa Association of Municipal Utilities meeting to be held in Des Moines from Oct 2 through 4th and to pay his expenses. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Sally Sorensen to approve the appointment of Ralph Wollenhaupt and Lillian Nichols to the Library Board for 6 year term for each. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Council Member Kenneth Perry introduced an Ordinance amending the City Code in Title II, Division 1 Chapter 2 Article 3 for its first consideration. Roll was called with all voting AYE.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RIDING OR WALKING OF HORSES OR MULES UPON CITY SIDEWALKS AND IN THE CITY PARKS AND PROHIBITING THE RIDING OR WALKING OF HORSES OR MULES UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE CITY DURING CERTAIN HOURS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

2.1-2.0320. No person shall ride or walk any horse or mule upon any sidewalk or in the city parks within the City of Fontanelle at any time. Riding or walking any horse or mule on any street within the City of Fontanelle is prohibited from the hours of one hour before sunset to one hour after sunrise.

Violation of this ordinance shall be considered a simple misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding \$100.00

This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage approval and publication as provided by law.

John Potts of Mid-State Engineering presented a bill from Maguire Iron in the amount of \$33,250. He also ask the Council to approve the remaining money that they have in Additional Engineering Services and Transfer that money to Resident Inspection .

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to take that remaining money that is designated for additional Engineering Services and transfer it to Resident Inspection Fund. Seconded by Sally Sorensen. Carried.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the bill to Mid State Engineering in the amount of \$433.55. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

An extension of contract was discussed but it was decided that both sides depend on good faith to finish the job on the tower.

There was a lengthy discussion about the old water tower. Delmer would like to have it remain as it is. He said that when the new tower has to be shut down for inside maintenance then we would have a good back up if the old tower was left . He stated that if the new tower had to be shut down for as long as two weeks there was no way that the 1 well could keep up with the daily demand. He said the average daily use was 75,000 gallons and that the peak had been 132,000.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to take down the old tower. Seconded by Sally Sorensen. Carried.

Dave Honz of Southern Iowa Council of Governments attended the meeting and presented the draw down and quarterly report.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to authorize the Mayor to sign Draw Down #21. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the application of Casey's General Store for a Beer Permit with Sunday Sales. Seconded by Sally Sorensen. Carried.

Motion by Sally Sorensen to approve the building permit of Dew Cass for two decks adjoining her residence; and of Chuck Williams for a deck along the east side of his residence. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Gene Smith who is remodeling the City Hall ask the Council what type of doors and trim they wanted to use. It was decided that the restroom door and the basement door would be hollow and that the door to the back room should be a solid door. They chose to go with mahogany Jambs and trim with Mr. Smith doing the finishing work.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to adjourn. Seconded by Sally Sorensen. Carried.
