Ron Smith of the United Telephone System met with the Council. He explained that starting July 1, 1989 the territory will be served by Con-Tel Co. He said rates won't go up because of the trade and that the local employees would remain the same. Any franchise would automatically be transferred.

Chris Tucker met with the Council to ask permission to hold a benefit car wash on June 1st.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to approve having a car wash to benefit Jamie Campbell to be held on June 1st at the N.E. corner of the square. Seconded by Sally Sorensen. Carried.

Applications were reviewed for the job of mowing the city properties.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to hire Dan Marnin to do the mowing of the city properties at \$3.50 per hour. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Ronald Purdy, representative of SIRHA met with the Council. He had been to a meeting in Red Oak with several dignitaries in attendance. He suggested that the Council get involved as there is money available for renovation. At present all the counties south of Adair are getting most of the money and he thought it was necessary for the city to get involved.

David Dinkel had presented the City with a new City Hall sign. A "Thank You" note is to be sent to Mr. Dinkel showing appreciation for the sign.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the Agenda as posted. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Clint Hight, city attorney met with the Council. He suggested that the proposed Ordinance to Amend TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, SUB-SECTION 2.1-2.0602 be published before its first consideration which is in accordance with 380.3 of the State Code of Iowa.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, SUBSECTION 2.1-2.0602

2.1-2.0602, Title II, Division 1, Chapter 2, Article 6 is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefore:

2.1-2.0602 SPECIAL STOPS REQUIRED. Every driver of a vehicle shall stop in accordance with the following:

1. Scott Street. Vehicles traveling on Scott Street shall stop at Fourth Street.
2. Main Street. Vehicles traveling East on Main Street shall stop at Third Street, Fourth Street and Eighth Street. Vehicles traveling west on Main Street shall stop at Third Street, Fifth Street and Eighth Street.
3. Jefferson Street. Vehicles traveling on Jefferson Street shall stop at Fourth Street and Sixth Street.
4. Maple Street. Vehicles traveling on Maple Street shall stop at Fourth Street and Seventh Street.
5. First Street. Vehicles traveling on First Street shall stop at Maple Street.
6. Third Street. Vehicles traveling on Third Street shall stop at Main Street.
