Ronald Purdy, representative of SIRHA met with the Council. He had been to a meeting in Red Oak with several dignitaries in attendance. He suggested that the Council get involved as there is money available for renovation. At present all the counties south of Adair are getting most of the money and he thought it was necessary for the city to get involved.

David Dinkel had presented the City with a new City Hall sign. A "Thank You" note is to be sent to Mr. Dinkel showing appreciation for the sign.

The City Council met in Special Session at the City Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Ralph D. Means presiding. Council Members present were: Albert Ehrenfried, Kenneth Perry and Gene Jacobsen. Absent: Sally Sorensen and Robert Edwards.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to approve the Agenda as posted. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Clint Hight, city attorney met with the Council. He suggested that the proposed Ordinance to Amend TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, SUB-SECTION 2.1-2.0602 be published before its first consideration which is in accordance with 380.3 of the State Code of Iowa.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, SUBSECTION 2.1-2.0602

2.1-2.0602, Title II, Division 1, Chapter 2, Article 6 is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefore:

2.1-2.0602 SPECIAL STOPS REQUIRED. Every driver of a vehicle shall stop in accordance with the following:

1. Scott Street. Vehicles traveling on Scott Street shall stop at Fourth Street.
2. Main Street. Vehicles traveling East on Main Street shall stop at Third Street, Fourth Street and Eighth Street. Vehicles traveling west on Main Street shall stop at Third Street, Fifth Street and Eighth Street.
3. Jefferson Street. Vehicles traveling on Jefferson Street shall stop at Fourth Street and Sixth Street.
4. Maple Street. Vehicles traveling on Maple Street shall stop at Fourth Street and Seventh Street.
5. First Street. Vehicles traveling on First Street shall stop at Maple Street.
6. Third Street. Vehicles traveling on Third Street shall stop at Main Street.

7. Fourth Street. Vehicles traveling South on Fourth Street shall Stop at Main Street.
8. Fifth Street. Vehicles traveling South on Fifth Street shall stop at Main Street.

This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law and upon the erection of stop signs at said locations.

Melvin Smith met with the Council to discuss his employment. He has been Chief of Police for 14 months. He wants reimbursement for his wife's insurance. At the time that Insurance was approved by the Council he chose to keep just the single policy since his wife worked for an insurance company and would rather keep her own policy. He ask the Council for \$140. per month for the reimbursement.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to pay Melvin Smith \$140. per month for the reimbursement of his wife's insurance until July 1st when wages will be discussed and raises decided upon. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to drop the sewer and landfill charge on the garage building of Melvin Smith since it is not used as a business. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.

Some older equipment that is stored in the shop was discussed. The Council agreed that if it doesn't run--sell it.

Motion by Albert Ehrenfried to approve the clerk's ordering park equipment for the Community Betterment Committee. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the application for a renewal of a liquor license for Robert Parkis dba Jo-Bob's. Seconded by Albert Ehrenfried. Carried.

Motion by Gene Jacobsen to approve the building permit of Gene Jensen for a new house. Seconded by Kenneth Perry. Carried.

Lights at the football field were discussed. This was tabled until the next meeting.

Motion by Kenneth Perry to adjourn. Seconded by Gene Jacobsen. Carried.
