Mrs. Brown told the Council that Volunteers would be painting the park equipment on June 14th. She ask the Mayor to proclaim June 29th as Clean Up-Preparation Day for the 4th.

Council Member Albert Ehrenfried made the motion to finally adopt an Ordinance Amending Title II, Division 1, Chapter 2, Article 6, Subsection 2.1-2.0602 entitle. Special Stops Required. Motion seconded by Council Member Robert Edwards.

Whereupon, the Mayor declared the Ordinance duly adopted as:

ORDINANCE NO. 128 A

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE II, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 2,  
ARTICLE 6, SUBSECTION 2.1-2.0602

2.1-2.0602, Title II, Division 1, Chapter 2, Article 6 is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefore:

2.1-2.0602 SPECIAL STOPS REQUIRED. Every driver of a vehicle shall stop in accordance with the following:

1. Scott Street. Vehicles traveling on Scott Street shall stop at (4th) Fourth Street.
2. Main Street. Vehicles traveling East on Main Street shall stop at Third (3rd) Street, Fourth Street (4th) and Eighth (8th) Street. Vehicles traveling West on Main Street shall stop at Third (3rd) Street, Fifth (5th) Street and Eighth (8th) Street.
3. Jefferson Street. Vehicles traveling on Jefferson Street shall stop at Fourth (4th) Street and Sixth (6th) Street.
4. Maple Street. Vehicles traveling on Maple Street shall stop at Fourth Street (4th) and Seventh (7th) Street.
5. First Street. Vehicles traveling on First Street shall stop at Maple Street.
6. Third Street. Vehicles traveling on Third (3rd) Street shall stop at Main Street.
7. Fourth Street. Vehicles traveling South on Fourth (4th) Street shall stop at Main Street.
8. Fifth Street. Vehicles traveling South on Fifth (5th) Street shall stop at Main Street.

This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law and upon the erection of stop signs at said locations.
