Police Chief Smith reported that the State forms will be changed and new ones ordered when this is done. On Nov. 15 a mandatory class will be given in Creston which Chief Smith is required to attend.

Motion by Pitts to send \$100 to the Sheriff's reserves. Seconded by Edwards. Carried.

The large oil tank on the old city lot was discussed and it was decided to see if Adair might buy the oil out of it. It will cost

approximately \$500 to have the tank moved from the old city lot to the new city lot. Motion by Ehrenfried to have the tank moved in the spring if not before. Seconded by Edwards. Carried.

The city's contract with WAPA for some of our electricity, has come up for renewal. A few revisions were noted and discussed. Motion by Ehrenfried to have Mayor Means sign the new contract and to have Delmer named as the contact person. Seconded by Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Ehrenfried to approve Carole Brown's building permit for a garage. Seconded by Thompson. Carried. Her request to remove a portion of her sidewalk was denied.

Motion by Thompson not to allow any more sidewalks to be removed. If a sidewalk is removed it must be repaired and replaced as soon as possible. Seconded by Ehrenfried. Carried. The clerk was instructed to put a notice in the paper to this effect.

The City of Fontanelle met November 19, 1990 at 6:30 p.m. in the city hall for a public hearing for the purpose of receiving input and suggestions concerning the application to the State of Iowa for a 1991 Community Development Block Grant for sanitary sewer improvements on the east side of Fontanelle and at the sewer lagoon.

Present were Mayor Ralph Means, Councilmen Ehrenfried, Pitts, Thompson, Hepler and Timothy Ostroski, Director of Southern Iowa Council of Governments. ~~March~~

The hearing was called to order by the Mayor at 6:30 p.m.

The need for the proposed activities was established in various public meetings, conversations with the city's engineer, surveys and by a special study by H. R. Green.

This sewer project will use State of Iowa CDBG 1991 funds and the city will provide the remainder. The application will be submitted by December 4, 1990. The requested amount of CDBG funds will be approximately \$200,000. The estimated portion of the CDBG funds requested that will benefit persons of low and moderate income is 75% or approximately \$150,000.

The proposed activities will be conducted during the fall of 1991 and summer and fall of 1992. No displacement of persons and businesses as a result of funded activities will occur.

No objections were voiced in person or in writing.

Motion by Ehrenfried to authorize the Mayor to execute the appropriate papers for the Community Development Block Grant. Seconded by Pitts. Carried.

Motion by Hepler to adopt a Resolution entitled:
AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE IOWA DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT, AND COMMITTING LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE PROPOSED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

Seconded by Thompson. Carried. Roll was called and the following voted: AYE: Thompson, Ehrenfried, Pitts and Hepler. NAY: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the Resolution duly adopted as:
