The Greater Fontanelle Community Foundation updated the council on the doctor situation and discussed a housing development.

Motion by Ehrenfried to approve Carole Brown's building permit for a shed. Seconded by Pitts. Carried.

Motion by Ehrenfried to join the Iowa Rural Water Association. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.

Two engineering firms responded with bids for the sewer project. They were scored according to Evaluation Criteria. Motion by Hepler to enter into contracts with H. R. Green. Seconded by Edwards. Carried.

Motion by Thompson to have Grandpa's Greenhouse apply fertilizer in the spring and fall to the park. Seconded by Edwards. Carried.

The community center window will be fixed and a bill sent to the responsible party.

A sign will be placed by the phone in the community center informing the public that no long distance calls are to be made from that phone. If a call is made, the person who's name the building was rented under, will be billed.

Tim Ostroski informed the council that a code of conduct agreement and procurement process papers would be prepared for the next council meeting. A contract with SICOG would also be presented at that time.
