Tom Mehl, of RUAN Securities Corp., discussed with the council the city's bond capacity. The city will be using interim financing during construction on the sewer renovations. Introduction by Ehrenfried of RESOLUTION 91.4 and motion for its adoption. Seconded by Thompson. Carried. After due consideration, roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Pitts, Ehrenfried and Hepler. NAY: None. Whereupon, the mayor declared the motion duly carried and the resolution adopted as:
