The Provisional IV service has been used twice since it was put into effect. This service very likely kept on patient alive as his blood pressure was getting dangerously low.

The new truck is usable but still has a few things that have to be taken care of. Chief Stewart is checking into having someone paint Summerset & Fontanelle Fire Department on the doors of both the new truck and the tanker.

Motion by Armstrong to approve a beer permit for the Country Diner. Seconded by Hepler. Carried.

At 7:15 the Mayor convened the Public Hearing on the status of funded activities in regards to the sewer project. Al Kunkel of SICOG read the status, which is as follows:

1. General description of accomplishments to date.

Construction is over 50% complete. Gravity sewer about 99% complete; removal of sludge and earthwork about 75% complete; outfall sewer 100% complete; and miscellaneous items.

2. Summary of all expenditures to date.

\$41,370.71 CDBG; \$20,685.36 City; \$62,056.07 Total.

3. General description of the remaining work. ~~and projects include~~

Complete lagoon structure with aeration equipment; surface access road; complete blower building, miscellaneous items; and cleanup.

4. General description of changes made to the CDBG project budget, performance targets, activity schedules, project scope, location, objectives, or beneficiaries.

Removal of pump station and force main as amended.

Al Kunkel presented an amendment to SICOG's administrative contract for the Mayor's signature. Motion by Armstrong to have the Mayor sign this amendment. Seconded by Pitts. Carried.

Al Kunkel also presented for the Mayor's signature a draw down in the amount of \$213,915.29 to pay the contractor. The CDBG share is \$142,610.14 and the City share is \$71,305.10. Mark Finsel of H R Green gave the break down of these costs. Motion by Armstrong to the Mayor sign the draw down. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

Bonnie Baum of the school system, gave the Council an update of the America 2000 program. She presented the community report card and told of the goals established. Motion by Thompson to accept the community report card. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.

Ordinance 133 was read into the minutes. The council instructed the Clerk to advertise a Public Hearing on Ordinance 133 - elimination of City Police department. - to be held on August 3, 1992, at the regular council meeting. Clint Hight's findings on the legality of a straw poll were discussed and possible ways to conduct the poll were considered. Motion by Tiedeman to have a straw poll and an article accompanying the ballot in the paper. Clint Hight will write the article explaining the reason for the poll. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.

Motion by Armstrong to have the voter print and sign their name, age and address on the ballot. After counting the votes, this information will be blacked out to protect the confidentiality of the voter. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.

The ballots will be printed in both the Observer and Free Press, and may be picked up at the City Hall. All ballots must be filled out completely or will be discarded before counting. Ballots will be received at City Hall until 5:00 pm on Monday, July 27, 1992. At which time no late ballots will be accepted. The City Clerk will report to the Council on August 3. the results of the poll.

The rent on the community center was discussed. At the moment the charge does not cover expenses. Motion by Tiedeman to raise the rent to \$35 starting immediately. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.

The need for stop signs on 2nd Street at Maple and yield signs on 3rd Street at Scott was discussed. Motion by Pitts to waive the first and second readings of proposed Ordinance 134 and moved for its adoption. Seconded by Thompson. Carried. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Tiedeman, Pitts and Hepler. NAY: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the Ordinance duly adopted on publication as:

ORDINANCE 134

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1992, BY ADDING TWO NEW SECTIONS, ON PROVIDING FOR TWO ADDITIONAL STOP SIGNS AND ON ONE PROVIDING FOR TWO ADDITIONAL YIELD SIGNS.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Delmer presented two estimates on overhauling the tractor. Motion by Armstrong to get a new gas engine if it can be done for \$3500 or less; or to have it overhauled as quoted by McCunn Equipment. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

Delmer also asked to purchase rock for use in street work with the oil taken from the large tank on the old town lot. The work would include as many street as possible by using the old oil. Motion by Armstrong to allow this purchase. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

Motion by Armstrong to change the location of the Handicap parking on the south of the park from the south side of the highway to the north side of the highway allowing easier access to the park. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

Turfcare had called stating that since we had received little rain, the spraying of the park should wait until fall.

Lois asked permission to attend an investment workshop in Red Oak on July 23. Motion by Pitts for Lois to attend. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.

Mel asked permission to attend an update seminar on July 8 & 9. Permission was given.

Motion by Thompson to adjourn. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.
