Delmer had checked the possibility of having a gasoline motor installed in the tractor, but they don't make replacement gas engines. The overhauling of the tractor by McCunn Equipment will begin as soon as the parts needed arrive.

Delmer also reported that a blue spruce tree in the park is sick. The only thing to be done is remove dead branches from it.

Mel asked the council if he could attend a school in Creston on stolen vehicles and changed VIN numbers on Aug. 5. There is no charge for this school. The council gave its permission.

Lois showed the council a letter received from the railroad. The city attorney is to offer the railroad \$1000 for all properties owned by them within the city limits.

Mike Cass asked the council for a letter of endorsement for the TLT (Tomorrows Leaders Today) Program. After he explained the benefits of this program, a motion by Armstrong was made to have Lois write such a letter. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.
