Mark Fincel of H. R. Green Co., reported to the Council that all the lien wavers and sales tax statements were in now. He also presented partial pay request #5. It is a request for the retainage amount of \$20,448.62. There has still been no agreement between Leo Jacobson and J. J. Westhoff, therefore it is suggested that we retain \$2120.00 until an agreement is reached. Motion by Armstrong to pay all but the \$2120.00 unless we are notified of an agreement within a few days, then we can pay the full amount. Seconded by Pitts. Carried.

Motion by Pitts to pay H. R. Green's invoice of final charges. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.

At 7:30 p.m. the Mayor declared the public hearing on the 93/94 budget convened. The budget estimate was considered and no objections were received. Motion by Thompson to adopt the budget and have the Clerk file it with the County Auditor, and to adopt a Resolution entitled:

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE  
FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1994

Seconded by Armstrong. Carried. Roll was called with the following voting AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Pitts and Hepler. NAY: None. whereupon the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

Motion by Armstrong to close the public hearing and continue with the regular meeting. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.

Closing the alley running east and west between 1st and 2nd St. and Washington and Main was discussed. Motion by Thompson to hold a Public Hearing closing said alley at 7:30 on April 5, 1993. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer informed the Council that there is only a relatively small amount of salt and sand mixture left. Since this amount could cover the streets in case of one ice storm, it was decided to hold off on buying any at this time, but if it becomes necessary, to go ahead.

Lois asked the Council if the 4-H group could put a plaque on the Community Center's wall. It recognizes the efforts put forth for an adopt a highway program. The Council was agreeable.

The monthly police reports were presented.

Motion by Pitts to adjourn. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried.
