Jeff Luther asked the council to consider closing half the alley running north from Main St. between 1st and 2nd streets. Motion by Armstrong to hold a public hearing May 3, 1993, at 7:30 p.m. to close said half alley. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

At 7:30 Mayor Pro-tem Pitts convened the public hearing to close the alley between Washington and Main running west from 2nd St. Motion by Hepler to suspend and dispense with the laws and rules providing that ordinances shall be fully and distinctly read on three different meetings, and that the proposed ordinance be placed on its last reading. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Tiedeman and Hepler. NAY: None Whereupon, the Mayor Pro-tem declared the ordinance passed and adopted as:

ORDINANCE 136

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE VACATION OF THAT PORTION OF THE EAST-WEST ALLEY DESCRIBED AS COMMENCING AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF LOT 2, THENCE EAST TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF LOT 3, THENCE SOUTH TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF LOT 4, THENCE WEST TO THE NORWEST CORNER OF LOT 5, THENCE NORTH TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, ALL IN FRACTIONAL BLOCK 4 OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN OF FONTANELLE, ADAIR COUNTY, IOWA

Motion by Armstrong to adopt a resolution proposing to sell alley listed as closed by Ordinance 136 at a public hearing to be held in conjunction with the public hearing scheduled for May 3, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. Seconded by Thompson. Carried. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Tiedeman and Hepelr. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor Pro-tem declared the resolution duly adopted as:

RESOLUTION 93.3

A RESOLUTION PROPOSING DISPOSAL OF AN INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY BY SALE, RESERVATION OF A UTILITY LINE EASEMENT AND APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE VACATION ALLEYS.

Motion by Hepler to close the public hearing and continue with the regular meeting. Seconded by Thompson. Carried.

Leo Jacobson had expressed discontent with the amount of acres allowed to him for crop damage. He feels he should be allowed approximately four more acres. Although the council does not feel legally bound to pay anything more, the future goodwill was taken into consideration. Motion by Armstrong to pay the Jacobsons 4.07 acres at \$450 per acre, with 1.57 acres to be paid out of the retainage due to Westhoff Const., if a signed release is signed by the Jacobsons. Seconded by Hepler. Carried.

The hiring of summer help was discussed. Motion by Armstrong to hire up to three persons for temporary summer help. Seconded by Thompson. Carried. The clerk is to run an ad twice to take applications due in by May 3. A decision will be made at the May 3 meeting.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

Delmer reported on the progress of the 4-H group's project of repairing or replacing the town's street signs.

The sewer possibility at the town lot was surveyed by H R Green. At the town building the sewer would be 12½ ft. deep.

Rebates for electrical appliances through CIPCO were discussed. It is felt that a program should be put together.

Mel's monthly reports were shown. The safety committee is to decide on Mel's requests.

A set of 1993 Iowa Code books is to be ordered.

Motion by Armstrong to adjourn. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried.

Chief Ray Stewart informed the committee that at least three more air packs need testing. Also, he asked to purchase two personal safety alarms to be worn by fire-fighters entering smoke-filled buildings. Motion by Nelson to purchase the safety alarms. Seconded by Hepler. Carried.

Chief Stewart reported that five more members of the department have qualified on the defibrillator. Also, the department has purchased a portable suction unit with memorials and other donations.

Motion by Nelson to adjourn. Seconded by Hepler. Carried.
