Ray Palzkill of Jet Lube, presented a proposal to install one or two new pumps in the sewer lift station. There is a 100%, 5-year warranty on the pumps. Motion by Armstrong to have two pumps put in at the quoted price for pumps and installation of \$18,150.

Budget spending for the next fiscal year was discussed. Suggestions on needs and cost were considered. A public hearing was set for the next regular meeting at 8:00 pm to approve proposed budget.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Delmer reported on the project to plant trees on the states right-of-way.

Next he explained the two electric outages of the past month. A bill will be sent to the engineers for cost related expenses.

Delmer asked the Council to compensate the landowners of the electric easement right-of-way.

Lois informed the Council that the group insurance cost had decreased. Also, that a spouse only option had been added.

Motion by Armstrong to adjourn. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Thompson to have the Mayor sign all three copies of the final documents for the electric project if the contractors bills are paid in the community and after the city's attorney checks the documents. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Tiedeman to have Dale Finck do the mowing this year for \$1500. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Genevive Dodds has resigned from the library board. The board would like to appoint Linda Jensen as the new board member. Also, the officers for the fire department was changed. The new Chief is Jon Ehrenfried, with Ray Stewart becoming Assistant Chief. Kaye Bax remains as secretary and Mary Miller remains as training officer. The Council gave its approval to both the library board and the fire department.

At 7:20 a Public Hearing was convened to approve an ordinance amending landfill fees. Motion by Armstrong to suspend and dispense with the laws and rules providing that ordinances shall be fully and distinctly read on three different meetings, and that the proposed ordinance be placed on its last reading. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Tiedeman, Pitts and Goff. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and adopted as:

ORDINANCE 139
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1992, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO LANDFILL FEES.

At 7:30, a hearing was held for Mildred Zimmerline regarding an abatement letter she had received. Mr. Maylander, Mrs. Zimmerline's attorney, informed the Council that the two unlicensed vehicles on the Zimmerline property are now under tarps. The Council decided to inform the City's attorney of the current situation before any further steps are taken.

Ralph Means asked the Council about the Lutheran's recycling efforts.

At 8:00 p.m. a hearing was held to discuss the proposed budget. Motion by Goff to approve the proposed budget estimate for publication with the Public Hearing being scheduled for March 7, 1994, at 7:30 pm. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

The departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Delmer informed the Council that the new water pump had been installed at the well and the old one sent to Layne-Western for an estimate to repair.

Delmer had also had the ladder truck and the digger derrick truck inspected. After viewing the reports, a motion was made by Armstrong to have the trucks fixed. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Jim Dickerson's sewer had backed up into his basement. Delmer is to check with sewer experts to find a way to eliminate the problem. A bill is to be sent to the Good Samaritan Center for the cost of chemicals, overtime labor and Dickerson's rug.

Melvin presented the police reports. He also presented a letter replying to the written reprimand of the January meeting.

Motion by Tiedeman to adjourn. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.
